PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AND TESTIMONY

VIEWING THE MEETING AND RESTRICTIONS ON ENTRY

Members of the public will not be allowed into the meeting room, but may view the meeting on a live broadcast. The meeting will be viewable: (1) by internet live streaming through www.honolulucitycouncil.com and (2) by televised live broadcast on Olelo TV Channel 54.

Some Councilmembers and presenters may be participating in the meeting by interactive conference technology from remote locations.

ORAL TESTIMONY

Oral testimony will be permitted on all items on the agenda, subject to the following restrictions:

- 1. Persons may submit oral testimony remotely through the Webex video conferencing platform. To participate, persons should visit www.webex.com, click "Join," enter meeting number 146 817 8231, and complete the registration process. Registrants will receive an email that contains links and information on joining the meeting by either phone or video conference. Webex testifiers are strongly encouraged to register at least 24 hours before the start of the meeting. Remote testimony will be taken at the start of the agenda and then closed.
- 2. Each speaker may not have anyone else read their statement and is limited to one-minute presentation.

- 1. RESOLUTION 21-160 APPOINTMENT OF ANTHONY B. AALTO TO SERVE ON THE HONOLULU AUTHORITY FOR RAPID TRANSPORTATION BOARD OF DIRECTORS. Relating to the appointment of Anthony B. Aalto to serve on the Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation Board of Directors for the term to expire on June 30, 2026. (Transmitted by Communication CC-275)
- RESOLUTION 21-146 ALTERNATIVES TO THE APPLICATION OF GLYPHOSATE-BASED HERBICIDES AND OTHER HERBICIDES AND PESTICIDES DEEMED CARCINOGENIC. Requesting the City Administration to consider alternatives to the application of glyphosate-based herbicides and other herbicides and pesticides deemed carcinogenic on City-owned and City-managed properties.
- 3. RESOLUTION 21-137 INSTALLATION OF BROADBAND FIBER WITHIN THE HONOLULU HIGH-CAPACITY TRANSIT CORRIDOR PROJECT. Urging the Mayor and the Department of Transportation Services to use American Rescue Plan Act funds to install broadband fiber within the Honolulu High-Capacity Transit Corridor Project guideway in order to provide Oahu with high-speed internet capacity through each rail station.
- 4. RESOLUTION 21-162 THE FEDERAL FISCAL YEARS 2019-2022 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM. Approving an amendment to the City and County of Honolulu's list of Federal Transit Administration and Federal Highway Administration candidate projects in the Federal Fiscal Years 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Program. (Transmitted by Communication D-518)

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5. <u>BILL 23 (2021)</u> – **RELATING TO PARKING.** Making changes to the restricted parking program established by ROH Chapter 15, Article 29, to refine the program and enhance community participation and support in the creation of areas with restricted parking. (Bill passed first reading on 5/5/21)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 23 (2021) (Submitted by Councilmember Cordero) – The CD1 (OCS2021-0698/7/14/2021 4:58PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. Removes all references to a residential permit parking zone.
- B. In SECTION 3, amends ROH Section 15-29.3(e) to allow (instead of requiring) the DTS director to establish a community advisory group for the RPZ to work with the department (and not the council) towards the implementation of an RPZ that addresses community security issues.
- C. In SECTION 4, adds a fee table to ROH Section 15-29.5(a).
- D. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
