PROPOSED CD1 TO RESOLUTION 21-166 (Submitted by Councilmember Cordero) – The CD1 (OCS2021-0778/8/16/2021 10:43 AM) makes the following amendments:

- A. In the first WHEREAS clause, updates the reference to the Charter to the current Council form, as follows: "Revised Charter of the City and County of Honolulu, 1973 (Amended 2017 Edition), as amended," and abbreviates references that follow as the "Charter."
- B. In the fifth WHEREAS and first BE IT RESOLVED clauses, adds language further identifying the term to which the appointee is to be appointed, as follows: "the term which began on July 1, 2021, and will expire on June 30, 2026."
- C. Adds a new seventh WHEREAS clause setting forth the requirement of Charter Section 6-107(h) that an appointee to the Commission have expertise in climate change in Hawaii.
- D. Amends the eighth WHEREAS clause to read as follows:

"WHEREAS, the Council of the City and County of Honolulu has reviewed Ms. Islam's qualifications and character as set forth on the attached Exhibit 1 and finds that she qualifies to serve on the Commission and deserves confirmation; now, therefore,"

- E. Attaches the nominee's voter certificate and resume as Exhibit 1.
- F. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
