The freedom of medical autonomy is one of many freedoms that we hold dear and it is also one of the four foundational pillars of medical ethics. Americans were never going to line up to dutifully do as they were told with regard to the vaccine, and they shouldn't. It is ok to question this vaccine. It's new. Downplaying or dismissing fears that others have only heightens those fears for those individuals. Allowing businesses to require this vaccine is also heightening those fears in these individuals. The health costs and the social costs need to be weighed against one another.

Written Testimony Yes, restaurants and gyms are a privilege but what about grocery stores? We cannot prevent members of our society from accessing basic needs such as groceries and toiletries. Barring members of society from entering grocery stores to access basic necessities can not be justified.

Barring unvaccinated members of society from participating in society is not an appropriate way to coerce our fellow citizens to get vaccinated. We must simply wait. Wait for them to feel safe. Help them feel safe with the vaccine. I am not scared to spend time around unvaccinated individuals. I know that since I'm vaccinated I will not die or end up in the hospital if I get COVID. I might not even know if I get sick because my vaccinated body will fight off the infection so quickly. So I'm not scared to spend time around my unvaccinated friends. Do I worry that they might end up in the hospital? Yes. But that is their choice. I'm not worried that I'll end up in the hospital. However, I am worried that my child, who is under the age of 12, might end up in the hospital. He wants to get vaccinated but can't.

Perhaps we should allow all of our willing citizens, children included, to be vaccinated before worrying about forcing those who are unwilling.
