My name is Keoni Kuoha.

I support removal of the stairs. I was born and raised in Waimānalo, Oʻahu. I have also worked at Papahana Kuaola, a mālama 'āina learning organization based in Ha'ikū Valley, most recently as the former Executive Director.

Written **Testimony** I have been a hiker since high school, and have hiked most of the mountains across Hawai'i. So, I understand and appreciate the joy and the pleasure individuals take from hiking. Through my experiences, guided by knowledgeable individuals, I have learned how to act within native ecosystems and how to care for native ecosystem. resources, all of which are Hawaiian cultural resources. Most hikers who access Ha'ikū Stairs have not been trained to act responsibly within native ecosystems. This is a serious problem for both the native ecosystems, as well as the Hawaiian cultural resources within these ecosystems. The Ha'ikū Stairs pose a threat to the very ecosystems and cultural resources that draw some people to it.

The majority of the Ha'ikū Stairs is located in the wao akua, which should not be entered except by those who have kuleana there. The vast majority of those accessing Ha'ikū Stairs do not have kuleana to be there. Therefore, much of the behavior of these hikers is not right for the wao akua which they are accessing—they enter the space without a kāhea and permission, they relieve themselves without knowledge of how to minimize that impact within wao akua, they

trample on native vegetation, and they conduct themselves without reverence to and observance of the traditional protocols of wao akua.

While at Papahana Kuaola, I also experienced many problems with trespassing hikers at the program's site in Ha'ikū Valley. Their lack of knowledge and observance of protocols extended to this site with significant cultural implications. Ceremonial and otherwise cultural spaces are maintained by Papahana Kuaola and the actions of trespassing hikers negatively impacted these spaces.

I ask the Council to please consider closing and removing Ha'ikū Stairs for good. It is the best way forward for Hawaiian cultural practice and endangered native ecosystems in Ha'ikū Valley.

I strongly oppose RESOLUTION 21-154 to remove the Ha'ikū Stairs. The resolution is inaccurate and/or misleading in several respects, and would result in a very unfortunate decision.

For example, the resolution strongly implies that reopening the Stairs would cost the City more than \$900,000 in repairs and other improvements – when in fact City Council Resolution 20-323 of last December, which the Council chose to vote down, would have put this burden on the Stairs' private sector operator. Even with these stringent conditions, 14 potential bidders provided detailed plans for operating the Stairs, in response to the City's 2020 Request for Interest. For example, the Friends of Ha'ikū Stairs Concept Plan for managed access is posted on their web site (https://d35fd6ab-97b3-4733-9c46-

a329e025adee.filesusr.com/ugd/e3df2a c273635d8be2451185b406f7a60f7045.pdf). It's a serious plan, for people who are serious about solving this problem.

The resolution also misrepresents the conclusions of the Board of Water Supply (BWS) EIS. BWS went into the EIS process determined to remove them, but by the end, they had concluded that Managed Access [re-opening the Stairs to the public under controlled management and supervision, funded by the operator from hiking fees, and not by BWS water rate payers] was the alternative that best met BWS's objectives – even better than tearing them out.

Managed access would include provisions for parking, entrance fees, comfort facilities, waste management, environmental mitigation, cultural education, safety, liability insurance, maintenance, and the security features discussed below. And managed access would in fact make money for the City, in the form of a percentage of the revenues. How does spending \$1 million of the taxpayer's money to tear them out make sense?

The Kāne'ohe Neighborhood Board [KNB] passed a resolution in 2017 strongly supporting re-opening the Stairs under managed access (https://kaneoheneighborhoodboard.blogspot.com/2017/06/text-of-kaneoheneighborhood-

boards.html?fbclid=lwAR0ntCMA44Q52gwoGvCzKC_WD9w3V6AVKPm9GjPjAA-YG-EcerCeEpfiFZs). You should take the time to read the case they made for doing so.

As for the influx of tourists, and their impact on resources: managed access is just that - managed. Hikers would be limited to 80 per day, and would need to get an online permit. The original access to the Omega Station up Ha'ikū Road could be restored with the stroke of a pen by the Governor. An off-site shuttle van could take hikers up to the Transmitter Building. The neighbors would not even see the hikers, much less feel their impact.

In sum, tearing out the Stairs is perhaps the worst option. What would it say about our state and our government if we destroyed a world-class resource because we couldn't figure out how to re-open a facility that used to operate unsupervised, with no trespassing, and no impact on the surrounding neighborhoods?

It might help the City Council to make an informed decision if they understood what prompted 20,000 people a year to hike the Stairs starting in the 1980s, when it was legal to do so [i.e., before it was 'forbidden fruit'] – even before the lure of 24/7 social media. What do these people see that our government does not? Why do people who normally take an elevator to avoid a flight of steps skip sleep and risk fine/arrest to climb 3922 of them, in an ascent that consumes more than 1000 calories?

As the KNB resolution notes, trespassing in the Haiku neighborhood is not acceptable, and must cease. Managed access cannot work unless this intolerable intrusion on people's privacy is eliminated.

There will always be those who do not want to pay a reasonable entrance fee, and attempt to enter illegally. Therefore, an advanced security system with high-tech monitoring equipment is critical from day one for the success of managed access. The operation must include a night-time security presence at the Stairs, in the valley, and within the community to prevent this after-hours trampling of lawns and invasion of privacy. Substantial and effective fencing would need to be installed at the base of the Stairs and several other strategic areas already identified in Ha'ikū Valley. At least one security guard should be on duty 24 hours a day, and a roving guard in the adjoining community would monitor for illegal hikers and report them to the police.

A Security Planning Group, inclusive of neighbors and all other stakeholders, should be set up to help develop and supervise the security operation, and should meet as often as necessary to improve the operation. The Stairs should not be re-opened until a solid solution is developed.

There is a real demand from the public that can't be met any other way. The Stairs are irreplaceable, and future generations should get to see why. The Stairs are an

incredible resource, and everything should be done to make their re-opening a success.

I reside in the Haiku Village neighborhood and have witnessed numerous disturbances from hikers at all times of the day. Testimony For The Removal of The Haiku Stairs

I can speak with familiarity and knowledge of some of the main issues regarding the Haiku Stairs (Stairway). As a hiker, I had the opportunity to use the stairway while it was operated by the United States Coast Guard. As an advocate of hiking, I volunteered at several of Oahu's trails. I enjoyed a forty plus year career as an agriculturist that included time in the private sector and later, with the Hawaii State Department of Agriculture as chief of Pesticide Registration and Applicator Certification. Since retiring from the Department of Agriculture, I have worked as an agricultural and environmental consultant. My tenure has given me experience in vegetation management, integrated pest management, alien species, endangered species, the impacts of pesticides on other resources. As a nearly fifty-year resident of Haiku Village, I witnessed firsthand some of the impacts of illegal hikers have on the abutting communities of the stairway. Furthermore, I authored a piece on the Stairway that appeared in a national magazine (Ford

Times). For this project, my research included resources from the library and actual interviews with the Coast Guard personnel who were stationed at the Omega Station who had responsibility for the management of and its access to the public.

PAST PRACTICES.

Like the Ala Wai Canal, the Stairway was never built for recreational uses. It was constructed during World War II to be a communications station to maintain contact with ships in the Pacific Ocean. Technicians used the stairs to service the station. Subsequently, the site transitioned into a U.S. Coast Guard navigation station for the Omega system one of about a dozen in the world.

During their tenancy, the Coast Guard allowed public access to the stairs for recreational use and managed its access efficiently and effectively.

- 1. Hikers were limited to 50 per day, distributed out to various hours during daylight hours only.
- 2. Prior reservations for date and time of the hike were required.
- 3. Entrance was through an electrically operated gate at the end of Haiku Road.

- 4. The Coast Guard could cancel access during bad weather or any other reason that would compromise safety.
- 5. Before making the climb, hikers had to sign in with proper identification. By the same token, they had to sign out when done.

There was minimal impact to the community because of the relatively small number of hikers spread out throughout the day. When Omega was replaced by newer technology, the Coast Guard vacated the property. This led us to where we are today.

CURRENT IMPACTS ON ABUTTING COMMUNITIES

For several years now, trespassing hikers have been going through the residential areas of Haiku Valley. The infrastructure of these communities cannot handle the additional traffic. Speeding vehicles at all hours, including night time, make it hazardous for residents. Hikers often speak loudly during the early hours of the morning, disturbing residents. Many hikers use the stairs at night.

They park on streets, blocking access to refuse collection. Often, they leave their doors open for long periods of time, blocking traffic. On occasion, they have encroached onto private driveways, making it difficult for residents to exit and enter properties.

POTENTIAL IMPACTS OF UNLIMITED FREE ACCESS TO THE STAIRWAY

Free uncontrolled access cannot help but affect residential communities and the institutions and businesses that abut the Stairway property. There must be limits as to the number of hikers permitted, just as the Coast Guard did. Today, without police presence, there are much more than the fifty per day of the past. Often, this number has exceeded 10 times as much. The current impacts to the residential and institutional communities are likely to continue with the stairway in place.

There are also the effects of unlimited access on the Hawaiian biota to consider. When I climbed the Stairway some thirty years ago, I identified several native plant and avian species. Some are listed as endangered by the U.S Fish and Wildlife Service under provisions of the Endangered Species Act (ESA). My observation was in passing and cursory. There are more. In fact, Hui Ku Maoli Ola, acting as a consultant, identified several others. This puts legal responsibility and liability on the

landowner(s) involved who must comply with the ESA as well as state laws that protect listed fauna and flora. In this case, it is the City and County of Honolulu. In other words, any damage or loss and the reporting of these losses and the legal penalty will fall on the shoulders of the City.

Furthermore, major threats to the native biota are pathogens: insects, weed seeds and spores, fungi, bacteria, and viruses. Prime examples are the decimation of the ohia forests on Hawaii Island by the *Ceratocystis* fungus and the spread of *Miconia* on Maui. A major pathway of pathogen dispersal is through human foot traffic. The sheer number of hikers on the Stairway poses a great threat as chances of pathogen dispersal increase. I mentioned two examples above. The loss of native species often has a domino effect—the loss of habitat, loss of species, and greater erosion. Many invasive flora cannot hold the soil as well as the native ones.

CAN A MANAGEAMENT PLAN WORK?

Proponents of keeping the Stairway have proposed a management plan, but can it work? In a perfect world, one with everyone following rules, respecting others and one where no one touches monk seals on the beach, yes. Again, referring to the past, hikers for the most part, followed rules, probably because the Coast Guard maintained a 24-hour presence on site. Also, with an organization such as the Coast Guard

involved, there is a perception of enforcement and consequences.

However, I believe that such a plan will not work today. Much has changed, the presence of social media, for one. Many people are willing to trespass, litter, vandalize, and assault residents, and this indicates that they will break any law or guideline a management plan can propose. There are bold signs saying that the Stairs are closed. Yet, companies bring trespassing hikers to the neighborhood. Others drive in and park on residential streets.

We are also seeing the results in Waikiki, Hana, Maui; northside Kauai, Maunawili, and Oahu's Northshore. We need only to learn from experiences of other areas to see what the result would be. It is not Hanauma Bay with only one access to the beach. A 24-hour presence? Strong enforcement? Is all of this realistically possible? The City and County of Honolulu, the current managers of the stairs have done a reasonably good job in maintaining police presence, cutting down the number of hikers. However, hikers still find a way around to get to the stairs. How long can they continue and at what cost? What about the residential communities?

To add further, recent gatherings in the middle of the covid pandemic took place, violating an emergency mandate in place

that prohibits such activity. In a nutshell, there are enough people who do not care.

IT MUST BE DISMANTLED

I can attest to the enjoyment one can have by negotiating the Stairway. I must weigh all factors, however. Removal of the stairway can have adverse environmental impacts. However, I feel it is still a less invasive option, for there is more control over the process of dismantlement and will involve less people than the number of hikers. Safeguards for contractors can be put in before the operation, and the process is a short term one, not forever. With this, the management of resources and the endangered species can be more easily managed, sans outside negative influences. Again, I must stress that I am not confident that hikers will follow any guidelines or plan.

While the view of the island the Stairway provides is indeed spectacular, it is not the only option on the island for hikers. Other sanctioned trails, lead to the summits of the Koolau Range and provide equally spectacular and panoramic views of the island. With this I favor the dismantling of the stairs as the only option that will work. I cannot favor subordinating human well-being and the loss of precious natural resources to satisfy recreational desires, especially when there are many other options available.

WHAT ARE THE HA'IKŪ STAIRS?

The Ha'ikū Stairs are metal stairs that ascend the Pu'u Keahiakahoe ["Kahoe's Fire"] peak near Kaneohe, Oahu. Starting from an elevation of 500 feet and climbing to more than 2,800 feet, they are comprised of 3,922 metal steps with handrails.

The Ha'ikū Stairs are more than a World War II artifact of historical significance, or a strenuous workout for those who like high places. The Stairs provide a unique experience of nature on the Windward Pali. No other site among the Hawaiian Islands packs the richness of geology, folklore, climate, botany, ethnobotany, entomology, and ornithology in such a short distance. The stairs ascend into a rich assemblage of native trees, shrubs, vines, herbs, and ferns, where more than 50 native and rare plant species can be found

WHY WERE THEY BUILT?

Immediately after the attack on Pearl Harbor in 1941, the U.S. Navy began planning a top-secret facility capable of communicating with the entire Pacific Fleet. In order to broadcast such a powerful signal, the Navy employed highly experimental technology with an antenna of unprecedented proportions with Ha'ikū Valley selected as the perfect site. The Navy stretched four 7'000-foot cables comprising the antennae across the top of Ha'ikū Valley, and in order to gain access to these ridges, the Navy built the Ha'ikū Stairs, otherwise known as the "Stairway to Heaven."

WHY ARE THEY CLOSED?

In 1987 the Coast Guard closed the Stairs to the public for repairs but were never reopened. After being turned over to the city, \$950,000 was spent in 2002 to repair them, however access issues prevented their reopening. In 2020, the Board of Water Supply turned the Stairs over to the City and County of Honolulu, yet the City is concerned about liability and is not set up to manage them independently.

ARE THEY DANGEROUS?

Although it is widely (and mistakenly) believed that the Stairs are dangerously unsafe, there are no documented reports of anyone suffering a serious injury on the Stairs. Indeed, the Stair's handrails and metal treads make them much safer than Hawaii's notoriously slick and eroding muddy clay trails, some of which are used to access the stairs from other valleys.

ARE THEY WORTH PRESERVING?

Would you want to tear down an architectural and engineering wonder unmatched in all the world, with fabulous views, that doubles as a climb through the clouds in a Hawaiian rainforest? The City and County of Honolulu has proposed just that.

Due to the importance, uniqueness and difficulty of the engineering and construction methods required to build the Stairs, they are eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. A historic preservation survey report stated, "the stairway endures as a manifest symbol of the innovative and rare design that enabled the U.S. military to send

messages around the world and assisted in saving countless lives during World War II." The Stairs are truly a unique treasure! The Historic Hawai'i Foundation listed the Ha'ikū Stair as one of Hawaii's most endangered historic places.

The Stairs are world famous, having been recognized by countless influencers and organizations including the BBC and the L.A. Times. National Geographic, called the Stairs one of the ten most endangered hikes in the world.

Although it is widely (and mistakenly) believed that the Stairs are dangerously unsafe, there are no documented reports of anyone suffering a serious injury on the Stairs. Indeed, the Stair's handrails and metal treads make them much safer than Hawaii's notoriously slick and eroding muddy clay trails, some of which are used to access the stairs from other valleys.

IS THERE A SOLUTION?

Yes! The solution we are proposing is the Concept Plan for Managed Use of the Ha'ikū Stairs. It effectively addresses all the valid concerns that have been raised

including security, access, trespassing, safety and liability. Managed Access can be implemented at ZERO cost to taxpayers. Start up costs - repairs, fencing, access trails, signage etc. will be covered and once the operation is up and running it will be cost neutral. The "Ha'ikū Stairs Experience" will be an educational and cultural experience and not just a recreational experience.

Opened and properly managed, the Stairway to Heaven would be a huge source of pride for the people of Hawaii, providing the opportunity to experience the awe of climbing through many micro- climates. No theme parks, no rides, no zip lines - just the climber and nature.

WHY NOW?

The City Council will vote to assign \$1,000,000 in next year's budget to remove the Stairs. This has been done despite the conclusion in the Ha'ikū Stairs EIS that, when compared to removal of the Stairs, the best option was to reopen the Stairs under managed access. In addition, there were 14 responses to a Request For Interest (RFI) last year. Isn't the next logical step to go ahead and send out a Request for Bids and not just remove the Stairs?!

Currently the stairs are illegal and without a managed program thousands of people a year climb the stairs trespassing on government and personal property. This has created a hardship for the Kaneohe community surrounding the stairs. We must find ways to end the intolerable trespassing on neighbors' property.

We have lost so much of the quality of life that made Hawaii a paradise. Now we have a rare opportunity to bring some of it back. Our economy could also benefit in the process.

Members of the Honolulu City Council, as a resident of Ha'iku Village, I strongly support and ask for your support of Resolution 21-154 Urging the City Administration to remove Ha'iku Stairs and its accessory structures to stop trespassing, reduce disturbances to local neighborhoods, increase public safety, remove potential liability to the City, and protect the environment.

Ha'iku Stairs was never intended for public access.

The stairs was built in 1942 during World War II for the purpose of reaching antennae and transmission facilities atop the Ko'olau ridge to send signals from the secret U.S. Naval radio station commissioned in Ha'iku Valley. Access was limited to military personnel.

Written Testimony

In 1950, the decommissioned Naval radio station became the U.S. Coast Guard Omega (navigation) Station, until it was decommissioned in 1997; officially ending the stairs military purpose and structural need.

There is no compelling reason to keep the stairs, but every reason to remove the stairs.

- 1. Closed access over the past decades has not been successful; despite government-erected fences, locked gates, law enforcement presence, and trespassing fines.
- 2. For public safety issues, particularly for first responders, who are already stretched thin with COVID-19 and rescues at far less strenuous and dangerous hiking trails.

- 3. For practical issues, e.g., attempts at managed access have been ineffective, especially with multiple points of access AND in the past 20 years, the city still has not figured out access.
- 4. For liability issues, such as the individual who traveled across several U.S. states to Hawaii to hike the stairs, knowing it was closed and there was a fine of \$1,000; then threatening on Hawaii News Now to sue when he was injured as he attempted to trespass through a homeowner's property.
- 5. Just read about the mitigation efforts to Koko Head Trail, Maunawili Falls, and Sacred Falls, as well as their closures that have lasted for weeks, to years and forever.
- 6. The government has never been successful in protecting the environment; we are locally, nationally and globally in a climate change crisis.

The city has \$1 million budgeted to remove the stairs. Partial removal of the lower half of the stairs would cost less than \$1 million and stop public access. Similarly, partnership with a 2nd party interested in acquiring the stairs would also cost less than \$1 million and stop public access.

We don't need to keep the stairs to provide cultural, environmental and historical education. The former Omega station can still be converted into a museum as proposed by the Friends of Ha'iku Stairs and the Ko'olau Foundation (many whom serve on the Kaneohe Neighborhood Board) to provide education. These two entities can also take on a land stewardship role to preserve and protect native species, instead of trying to mitigate damage from access, which they have not been able to do to date.

In addition, during this COVID crisis, government and elected leaders have made the realization that the community's best interest must be considered now more than ever, with the promise and recognition that tourism must be downsized. Keeping the stairs would be counter to this collective narrative.

I hope the City Council is bold enough to rule in favor of the impacted community over special interests by supporting Resolution 21-154 to remove Ha'iku Stairs.

I oppose resolution 21-154. I quote a recent article by Charles Burrows:

Save Haiku Stairs for cultural, environmental education!

Anyone who has climbed to the top of Haiku Stairs would never advocate tearing them down.

The cable house at the summit sits close to the magnificent peak of Puukeahiakahoe. The astounding wonder and glory of Koolaupoko surrounds you and commands heightened awareness of of your responsibility to respect and care for all that encompasses you.

Written **Testimony** As a Native Hawaiian cultural practitioner and environmental science educator, I took my Kamehameha Schools high school students up Haiku Stairs 40 years ago, to instill this responsibility, teach them about the cultural and environmental history of the area, and guide them in conducting field studies. I was not alone in doing this; in the years the stairs were open, many educators and scientists used the stairs as an open-air classroom and science lab, along with science clubs and conservation organizations. Access to places like Haiku Stairs is critical to enriching the quality of educational experiences and increasing students' absorption of knowledge. But now the City Council is advocating removal of the Haiku Stairs.

Educational research has shown that if students open a book to study the mo'olelo of Haiku, its watershed, geology or endangered plants, they may understand it, but they probably won't care that much about

it compared to seeing and learning these things standing on Puukeahiakahoe. If kids can't experience the Haiku watershed and touch, smell, investigate, explore and connect to it, their knowledge retention and understanding drops exponentially.

Children as well as adults need to experience incredible venues like this in order to build connections that will lead them to invest time and energy into advocating for preservation and conservation of these places throughout their lives. But we are seeing the door closing on access to Haiku Stairs and other areas as we speak.

In the case of Haiku Stairs, we see the city taking ownership of that mountain and forbidding any taxpayer who paid for the acquisition of that land to access it ever again. We, the taxpayers who paid \$1 million in 2002 to repair the stairs, are now being told we will pay \$1 million to tear down access to a place we should have the right to access. In addition, the Department of Hawaiian Homelands is forbidding hikers to cross a sliver of DHHL property to access Haiku Stairs, treating the area like private land and citing liability concerns.

Can you imagine if we permanently closed down our beach parks like Sandy Beach, Hanauma Bay or Pipeline because of liability concerns? They remain open despite an average of 65 drownings in the ocean here every year. In seven decades, there has never been anyone seriously injured climbing Haiku Stairs. When asked what expenditures it had made over 20 years to pay for insurance, settlements or court costs, the Board of Water Supply acknowledged in its environmental impact statement, "There have been no claims or settlements regarding the Haiku Stairs."

The city's own Koolaupoko Sustainable Communities Plan requires it to "protect scenic views, provide recreation, and promote access to shoreline and mountain areas," and "preserve significant historical features and retain significant vistas with significant archaeological features." Yet this is being ignored. Educational opportunities are in jeopardy.

Haiku Stairs is next on the chopping block, if we don't fight to save it. There is a brilliant plan created by Friends of Haiku Stairs to protect the area, manage it and eliminate any disturbances to Haiku neighbors, but instead of implementing it, the Council has resolved to eradicate access to this historical, recreational, educational and cultural area forever.

Vote no on 21-154, don't let the Haiku Stairs be victim of the cancel culture.



Honolulu City Council Resolution 21-154

URGING THE CITY AMINISTRATION TO REMOVE THE HA'IKŪ STAIRS AND ITS ACCESSORY STRUCTURES TO STOP TRESPASSING, REDUCE DISTURBANCES TO LOCAL NEIGHBORHOODS, INCREASE PUBLIC SAFETY, REMOVE POTENTIAL LIABILITY TO THE CITY, AND PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT

September 8, 2021	10:00 a.m.	Council Chamber

The Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) <u>SUPPORTS</u> the intent of Resolution 21-154, to finally address the overwhelming and long-standing impacts that the Ha'ikū Stairs have had on adjacent Native Hawaiian efforts to perpetuate native species and associated, constitutionally protected Native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices, and to normalize 'Ōlelo Hawai'i through a culturally and linguistically enriched learning environment.

As an initial matter, OHA emphasizes that the unjust loss of lands and governance has resulted in particular and unique harms to the Native Hawaiian community, which continue to manifest in numerous ways today. The state and federal governments have recognized these harms, as well as the need to continuously seek reconciliation with the Native Hawaiian people by addressing the impacts and restoring the losses that have arisen from these harms. Notably, the state constitution – as repeatedly confirmed by the Hawai'i Supreme Court – specifically recognizes the affirmative constitutional obligations of the state and its political subdivisions to protect and enforce Native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices, and further places an affirmative obligation on the state to facilitate the normalization of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i after generations of suppression and neglect.¹

Unfortunately, government action and inaction has continued to fall far short of the vision and promises of reconciliation underlying these commitments and legal obligations. In the case of the Ha'ikū Stairs, the government's inability to manage the hundreds of daily visitors drawn to this attractive nuisance has, for over a decade, significantly impacted adjacent Native Hawaiian efforts to propagate and restore highly endangered native plant species — critical to the perpetuation of constitutionally protected Native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices — and to normalize 'Ōlelo Hawai'i through a Hawaiian immersion education public charter school. Unfortunately, despite repeatedly voiced concerns regarding trespassing, frequent and highly disruptive rescue operations, littering, criminal activity, and

the general loss of cultural integrity and physical security resulting from this unmanaged influx of individuals and groups, meaningful action to address these problems has yet to be taken – notwithstanding numerous promises by various entities to seek some form of "managed access" made throughout the years.

Accordingly, OHA appreciates and supports this resolution's call for timely and decisive action to finally address the numerous impacts of the Ha'ikū Stairs on adjacent areas, including and in particular the Native Hawaiian spaces hosting critical efforts to restore and propagate native species necessary for the perpetuation of Native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices, and to revive and normalize 'Ōlelo Hawai'i. Indeed, for the reasons described above, OHA strongly believes that affirmative Council action on this measure may in fact be necessary to help our state and county governments fulfill their constitutional obligations as well as the repeated commitments made to seek reconciliation with, and restorative justice for, the Native Hawaiian community.

Therefore, OHA urges the City Council to **ADOPT** Resolution 21-154. Mahalo nui loa for the opportunity to testify on this matter.

IN STRONG SUPPORT

Ke Kula 'o Samuel M. Kamakau, Laboratory Public Charter School is a PreK-12 Hawaiian Medium school that sits at the base of the Stairway to Heaven. We STRONGLY SUPPORT the Adoption of Resolution 21-154, which urges the City Administration to REMOVE the Ha'ikū Stairs.

The safety of our students, staff and families are at-risk as long as the stairs continue to exist, even under the alternatives that continue to be proposed for the following reasons-

- Trespassers consistently come onto the school campus, at times threatening and harassing students and staff. Our students experienced hikers who stumbled on campus smoking marijuana.
- Trespassers park alongside the state access road accessible from Ha'ikū Road and Kūneki Street, regardless of the numerous posted signs at the entry.
- Trespassers have damaged the entry gate when this gate is locked after hours.
- The school has experienced property damage (cutting of fences) in order to get to the stairs.
- Our families have been in numerous confrontations with trespassers after kindly asking them to leave the private property.
- The School has experienced repetitive unsanitary conditions including litter, human fecal matter left directly outside of our school gate and other biohazards left by trespassers.

The burden continuously falls on the school to address trespassers and the damage they cause on a regular basis. The school spends staff time and thousands of dollars a year to address these issues, which ultimately takes away from the educational needs of students. Secondly, it poses an unnecessary liability for our school and our non-profit organization who holds the license on this property. This is completely unacceptable.

We were involved in the stakeholder feedback draft process of the Draft BWS Environment Impact Statement and again to provide comments upon the completion of the draft. We strongly supported the BWS proposed action to completely remove the Ha'ikū Stairs then and now for the following reasons-

- The absence of viable solution to keeping and managing the stairs; while years have been devoted to this study, there has been little progress in identifying "managed access" and land owners have not agreed to usage of access roads (eg Ha'ikū Rd, Kūneki St)
- The previously proposed alternatives do not sufficiently address the safety risks posed to our students, families and staff

We ask you to please ADOPT Resolution 21-154 and the Removal of the Ha'ikū Stairs. We thank you for placing a high consideration on the feedback being shared by our Hawai'i residents, especially those who are are affected daily.

Aloha mai kākou,

My name is Kalehuakea Kelling and I am a resident of the He'eia community, as well as a graduate of Ke Kula 'o Samuel M. Kamakau who sits directly below Ha'ikū stairs. As a kama'āina to this place I hold dear, I am in STRONG SUPPORT of the removal of these very stairs. I ask that you take these reasons into consideration:

- First and foremost, the name known to this area, "Ha'ikū stairs" actively erases the
 traditional names given to this sacred space. Stewards and community members alike
 have familiarized themselves with this mountain as Keahiakahoe by mo'olelo and oral
 histories told through generations that originated long before the construction of the
 stairs.
- Secondly, the stairs were built during the time of World War II and no longer serves a purpose other than a hike with a scenic view used to entice tourists and hikers into a place they do not belong. Through mo'olelo, we also know that in this realm dwells a guardian deity, Kameha'ikana, who is a physical manifestation of Haumea. As kanaka, these are realms we do not belong in as it could be dangerous, especially to those unfamiliar to the area and to those who do not know how to act properly in the presence of said deities.
- Third, hikers who invite themselves to this area, pose a threat to the well-being of the students at Ke Kula 'o Samuel M. Kamakau. During my time as a student there, I have encountered various hikers who were not understanding when asked to leave as they set foot onto private property where there were children present. Not only do they harass students, they also damage school property in an attempt to cut gates and locks in order to access the stairs. Following the damage, the school is then responsible for replacing the items that were cut which becomes an inconvenience for the school who funds many of its own facilities by means of their own funding.

It is for these reasons that I STRONGLY SUPPORT Adoption of Resolution 21-154, to remove Ha'ikū stairs in order to ensure the safety of students, as well as beginning the restoration process for this 'āina to heal.

Aloha,

I strongly support the removal of the Ha'iku Stairway. I am a parent and community member who has witnessed the irresponsibility, recklessness, and natural destruction of the stairway and it's foundation.

The stairway is near my daughter's school, Ke kula o Samuel MK Kamakau. On many of our drives to and from the campus, I have witness several inexperienced hikers trying to locate the entrance. They disregard private property, laws, and safety of not only themselves, but my child, her classmates, the staff, and our first responders.

Some hikers have become irate and disruptive when asked to turn around considering the grounds are illegal to access. 9 out of 10 visitors (whether local or not) ignore our requests and continue on their journey. They go on to the campus to speak to our children which is an endangerment to them and the staff. They have left their trash and personal excrements at the entrance to her campus. They have invaded the homes of the residents located within the residential area and they continue to disregard the safety of our first responders who will be tasked to rescue them when nature decides to reroute their journey.

Additionally, there are financial implications to fixing, maintaining, and long term management of such a location. What would be a cost for us at this time would be minimal to the financial budgetary needs to completely restore the stairs and then to assign management of such area as well as it's continued maintenance for an area known for heavy rains and run-off. Regardless if this is handled by an outside source, the land would still be the sole responsibility of this council in it's entirety. HAIKU STAIRS REMOVAL TESTIMONY

I have lived on the cul-de-sac at the end of Puoni Place (below Haiku Stairs) for about 20 years and problems with the stairs were present when I moved here and persist today. All attempts to come to resolution on the issues have been persistently delayed. In the meantime, the problems have become more severe with the advent of social media and increased access to the internet. The local hikers have been far surpassed by international and domestic tourist and military hikers in number.

Delays are costing more money as continued patrolling by the HPD becomes necessary and rescues become more plentiful.

Issuing citations is a waste of time and money because the majority of the cases get thrown out because the Prosecutor's Office will not take the time to pursue these. Rescues, at present, are not billed to the hikers, requiring the service, and are paid for by the City.

Kudos to HPD for their efforts in enforcement with the large electronic sign on Kahuhipa Street and their increased presence in the area with multiple officers and UTVs. A significant reduction in illegal hikers has been realized with these actions.

RESCUES

Rescues in the area have become more frequent and often involve the HFD rescue helicopter in addition to HFD engines and EMS. The crews required in these rescues are huge. I imagine the cost of these rescues has increased significantly in the last 5 years. It's ironic that if you fall off your roof and need ambulance service, there will be a hefty bill waiting, the City will not foot the bill and yet, illegal hikers get rescued for free.

TOUR HELICOPTER TRAFFIC

The tour helicopter traffic in the area has been and is a worsening nuisance. Although hiking traffic has been reduced by enforcement, the tour helicopter fleet is not affected and is increasing significantly. Flights over the Haiku Stairs is a regular feature with these helicopters. I have witnessed up to 3 tour helicopters hovering in the area waiting for their run at the stairs. Depending on atmospheric conditions, rotor, transmission and engine noise can be bad enough to prevent normal conversation. There is no way to reduce this nuisance except by removing the stairs. It is interesting that helicopter tours through National Parks has been restricted due to noise, but not tour flights over residences. We, as residents, are not here for a couple of days of sightseeing, we live here and have no choice but to endure the noise on a daily basis throughout the year.

We also have other helicopters that fly the area. The Hawaiian Electric inspection teams inspecting power lines, Honolulu Police Dept. monitoring traffic on H-3 or looking for fugitives, filming companies shooting movie footage, military overflights to the Marine Base in Kaneohe, occasional construction flights and the increasing rescue flights. These flights I would consider necessary and are much smaller in number than recreational tour flights.

LEGALIZED AND MANAGED ACCESS

I sincerely doubt that the efforts to "manage" the hikers will be viable. Unless 24 hour security is provided, there will always be people skirting the rules resulting in continued trespassing on government and private property and continued patrolling. I also doubt that the effort would be financially viable.

Aloha Chair Waters, Vice Chair Kia'āina, and Members of the City Council:

The Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) submits testimony in support of this resolution. As an adjacent landowner, DHHL shares the community's concern that property rights be respected and landowners not be exposed to undue liability. Like many of the property owners in this area, DHHL has experienced problems with trespassing and vandalism since obtaining title to approximately 140 acres of land in Haiku Valley. DHHL's intent in accepting these lands was to develop residential homestead for our beneficiaries. However, based on the development cost to upgrade the existing infrastructure and the impact that such development would potentially cause to the surrounding community, we have determined that our limited resources could be better used to develop other lands at this time. While we recognize the unique experience, panoramic views, and the sense of achievement that attracts hikers to the Haiku Stairs, safety and liability concerns and the risk to the Department is far too great for consideration; therefore prudent management dictates that DHHL support this resolution.

Kamakau is located at the base of the mountain in a forest; it's remote, with just one long gravel road for access and spotty cell reception. The stairs invite unnecessary traffic to this secluded area.

Every time I see these lost trespassers on the kula grounds, wandering around near the playground and cafeteria, I worry about the safety of our children in general but especially at such an isolated location.

I STRONGLY OPPOSE Resolution 21-154 that seeks to remove the Haiku Stairs.

- (1) The Haiku Stairs are an important and unique Hawaii treasure.
- (2) The Haiku Stairs did not cause inconvenience to the neighborhood when managed by the USCG.
- (3) Resolution Topic: Stop Trespassing and Reduce Disturbances to Local Neighborhoods: The Managed Access Plan eliminates problems in the neighborhood and eliminates trespassing from the windward side. It is the lack of managed access that has caused the problems.
- (4) Resolution Topic: Increase Public Safety and Remove Potential Liability to the City: The Haiku Stairs have an impeccable 7-decade history of safety, with almost no serious injuries. They are absolutely the safest way for climbers to access the ridge. Deliberate removal of the Haiku Stairs by the city will directly cause more hikers to use the much more hazardous Moanalua Valley Trail, directly causing more serious injuries and possibly deaths.

Written Testimony

- (5) Resolution Topic: Protect the Environment: The Environmental Impact Statement commissioned by the Board of Water Supply found the alternative to convey the stairs to the Department of Parks and Recreation for managed access scored the highest much higher than removal of the stairs. Managed access brings with it education and appreciation for the cultural and environmental well-being of the mountainside. Hikers cause more environmental damage climbing the dirt Moanalua Valley Trail than stepping on the steel steps of the Haiku Stairs.
- (6) To address the concerns raised by this resolution, the best solution is managed access and not removal.

On April 27, 2020 the Board of Water Supply, which at the time owned

the property containing the Haiku Stairs, considered the removal of the Haiku Stairs. The Board of Water Supply conducted an impressive online public hearing on the topic that elicited 4,489 pieces of written testimony and many hours of oral testimony. The testimony was an overwhelming 90% in favor of keeping the Haiku Stairs while implementing a management plan to control access, and only about 10% in favor of removing the Haiku Stairs.

The Board of Water Supply decided upon a course of action favored by Mayor Kirk Caldwell that would transfer ownership of the affected property to the City's Department of Parks & Recreation. This was a sound decision. The Environmental Impact Statement commissioned by the Board of Water Supply found the alternative to convey the stairs to the Department of Parks and Recreation for managed access scored the highest. The Haiku Stairs are exceedingly safe, and removal of the stairs would have led to more hikers climbing from the much more hazardous Moanalua Valley Trail, causing more serious injuries and possibly deaths.

The property transfer was completed on July 1, 2020 and the City started to develop proposals for management of the Haiku Stairs to include control of access, limitations on the numbers, transportation of hikers to the stairs, security, and liability. These measures are designed to protect the environment and the peace and quiet of the nearby neighborhood. The City received 14 qualified bids and proposed a 12-year concession agreement for a managed access plan and guided hikes at the Haiku Stairs which the City Council recommitted to the Committee on Economic Assistance and Revitalization.

The rationale for the City spending about \$1M for restoring those stairs nearly 20 years ago was sound. With solid steps and handrails, they provide the safest access for many people to enjoy both the exercise and the spectacular views from the ridge. That rationale remains valid.

The stairs were made as good as new but the failure of various government agencies to implement a fair agreement for access to the stairs was irresponsible. For example, in 2004 the City and the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands worked out a responsible agreement to exchange 53 acres of the City's undeveloped land at Varona Village for 65 acres of DHHL land in Haiku Valley, but in September 2004 the City Council put the deal on hold pending more information about the city's plans and costs for the Haiku Valley. City Managing Director Ben Lee was reportedly frustrated by the postponement of what he called a "win-win" situation. It is the lack of legal access that has subjected the surrounding neighborhood to abuse over the years.

The Friends of Haiku Stairs has developed a Concept Plan for Managed Use of Haiku Stairs that comprehensively addresses all of the concerns that have been raised. The plan is sustainable, including an environmentally sound and sustainable business plan, limiting use to 80 hikers per day, using vans to transport hikers from an off-site staging area to the trailhead eliminating neighborhood contact, utilizing staff members and the use of color coded RFID wristbands to manage

hikers, and measures to eliminate trespassing including effective fencing, security cameras with night vision capability, the use of off-duty HPD officers to issue trespassing citations, 24/7 security including use of a second guard placed on the stairs above the point where any trespassers would join the stairs (such as the 1st platform), and a Security Planning Group composed of neighbors, HPD, private security, the operator, and FHS to implement and supervise the security operation. The key is to issue a \$1,000 trespassing citation 24/7 to any unauthorized person on the stairs by checking the RFID or issuing the citation at the first platform (or other location above section 60) that would catch 100% of people coming up from various paths from the Kaneohe side.

The Kaneohe Neighborhood Board unanimously took a position SUPPORTING REOPENING THE HAIKU STAIRS TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC UNDER A CONTROLLED AND MANAGED ACCESS PLAN.

Substantial progress was made in the last 6 months of 2020 toward resolving remaining issues and creating a safe, legal, managed, environmentally sound plan that would not impact the nearby neighborhood. The City now has the ability to safely and responsibly bring the recreational potential of the stairs to fruition. Now is the time to apply skill and expertise to finally resolve this long-standing issue by concluding a fair agreement for managed access to the stairs, and not the time to suddenly reverse course and remove the stairs.

I am writing this letter in support of the complete removal of the Haiku Stairs.

When I moved into the Hokulele subdivision in 1999, I had no idea I would be moving into a living hell due to the constant and egregious trespassing from hikers trying to access the Haiku Stairs. Over the span of 20 years and with the proliferation of social media, there has been a monstrous amount of hikers disrespectfully traversing through our neighborhoods and through our properties for this hike. It has come to a point where that number is between four to five thousand a year and that's only the ones we have documented, reported, or that the police have turned away. To say that this problem has negatively impacted the quality of life for my family and my neighbors is an understatement. I personally have had hikers walk within 10 feet of my bedroom window disrupting our sleep between 1:00am-4:00am too many times to count. Hikers have consistently blocked our driveways to such an extent that before special duty officers were acquired, we have had our trash left as is because the garbage truck couldn't access it. That's not even the worst of it. We have been yelled at, threatened, and blatantly ignored on a regular basis when telling hikers to get out of our properties.

When special duty officers were hired, it helped a little, but because very few citations were issued, hikers continued to find ways to get around them. The lack of enforcement efficacy, the unmanageable nature of multiple access points, the overwhelming negative effects on residents' quality of life, and the constant rescues that put our first responders at risk make the stairs a significant liability and an absolute nuisance.

I strongly support the removal of the stairs and believe there is no other alternative. There is overwhelming evidence that indicates that a managed access plan will not work. Dear Councilmembers,

The people of Oahu are once again writing in mass to express our opposition to the destruction of the Haiku Stairs. Forget about the massive amount of testimony surrounding how sacred or "magical" of an experience climbing the stairs are. Although those reasons matter too, I am sure you prefer to look at logical solutions to problems and not get tied up in emotions. Keep in mind the individuals in favor of demolition are also voicing opinions from an emotional standpoint. They fail to see logical facts surround the issue. They want the stairs gone, and plug their ears and refuse to hear any testimony describing how a managed access plan will alleviate the problems the Haiku neighborhood experiences. Your decision should come down to simple reasoning: destroying the stairs will lead to more negatives; managing the stairs will lead to more positives.

The decision to move forward with the stairs' removal goes against the C&C's own Environmental Impact Statement findings. In the 2020 EIS, reopening of the stairs under a managed access plan was the best solution. A managed access plan that avoids the Haiku neighborhood is very feasible and has been described. This is the better solution for the environment. Although the Haiku neighborhood has valid concerns, many people live in neighborhoods with popular trailheads. Potential problems are mitigated with signage telling people where to park and how to access the trail without trespassing. The fact that managed access plans for Haiku Stairs completely remove the neighborhood altogether should alleviate these concerns.

Closing the stairs will only increase traffic through the much eroded and difficult Moanalua Valley trail, leading to more injuries and need for rescue. People only attempt this hike because the stairs are off-limits, with this route often described as "the legal way." Removing the stairs won't stop this, as people are doing it for the panoramic views, not because of some weird widespread love of stairs! Meanwhile, climbing the actual stairs is safe, and I have not yet heard a single story of a rescue needing to occur on the stairs themselves. How many people need to be rescued from Diamondhead every month?

Managing the stairs is outright the most fiscally responsible thing to do. Invest in this landmark, charge entrance fees to pay for maintenance, and generate excess funds for other departments. The same EIS mentioned above pointed out the city would be \$2.1 million better off under a managed plan vs. removal. And that's assuming removal stays within the \$1 million budget. We all know this isn't likely, with \$1 million simply being a placeholder for future budget overruns. We have all seen how wildly popular the site can be. Why not make tourists pay? The money raised can easily make a profit for our cash-strapped city. Money that can go towards roads, schools, and conservation efforts. Spending \$1 million (+) to remove is just that: spending. Worse is that it's money we don't have, and can never come back. Once its spent it's gone, along with a precious landmark and a revenue generating opportunity.

Please do the right thing. Listen to the will of the people instead of a few politically connected individuals lobbying for removal. Listen to the city's own EIS. Listen to logic.

- 1) Environmental concerns (Hikers introduce destructive invasive
- species into Haiku Valley destroying native species of flora and fauna 2) Stairs management concerns (there is no viable plan to ethically, environmentally and sustainably manage the stairs in perpetuity)
- 3 Local resident concerns about disruptive and damaging hikers(There is no viable solution to the problem of local community degradation due to local and international tourism fueled by insatiable and

unstoppable social media attention.)

- 4) Mis-spent taxpayer dollars (According to recent emergency responder testimony on this bill, 16 human resources are required to provide for the rescue of 1 wayward stranded illegal hiker. endangering a total of 17 lives at a minimum and diverting 16 resources from local taxpayers. Right now the city does not bill illegal hikers for rescues on the off-limits Haiku Stairs.)
- 5) Definition of trail. (Haiku Stairs is not a trail or a hike- it is a manmade structure that requires repairs, and incurs incredible liability for the city and county of Honolulu and the department of Hawaiian Homelands regardless of who they find to "manage" it.)

- 6) Scale concerns- (Once the stairs begin to be managed by a forprofit entity they will likely increase access to the stairs to meet demand)

Testimony submitted to the City Council, City and County of Honolulu supporting Resolution 21-154 Urging the City Administration to Remove the Haiku Stairs

I appreciate the opportunity to provide testimony supporting Resolution 21-154 *Urging the City Administration to Remove the Haiku Stairs*. I have lived on the windward side my entire life, in Kaneohe since 1969, and in my current residence in Haiku valley since 1975. During this time things have changed dramatically and what was once a couple of people going up the stairs every so often is now dozens per day trying and, unfortunately, many of them succeeding. Those people who want to see the sunrise/sunset or experience the challenge of climbing the stairs in a rain, thunder, or lightning storm will do it no matter what rules or measures are in place to try to properly manage the stairs. The decisions of these irresponsible people put themselves at risk but more importantly risk the lives of our emergency services personnel.

Sadly, the approximately \$250,000 spent annually to try to stop people isn't working as evidenced by the number of people I see on the stairs every day from my home. Management of the stairs has been and continues to be impossible given the many access points trespassers can use to reach the stairs. When a person from Florida tells me at 1 am in the morning as he drinks from my water hose that he flew all the way to Hawaii to climb the stairs because of something he read on social media, you can believe he wasn't and wouldn't be deterred by arrest or fines nor would he respect rules and hours of operation should the stairs be put under a managed access entity. These people will do whatever they can to check the "Stairway to Heaven" box on their bucket list. People will try no matter what unless the stairs are removed.

In addition to the problems and liability hikers present to the surrounding neighborhood and land owners, I don't believe that it is environmentally responsible to allow people up the stairs in what is a sensitive area that produces the water we drink. Furthermore, the educational value of the stairs can easily be provided by existing parks such as Aiea Loop Trail. The real reason the stairs are attractive is because of the thrill factor; not education, nature appreciation, or the wonderful view. Why else would someone climb up during a rainstorm when clouds completely obscure the view? When all these factors are taken into consideration, I believe the best way to handle the Haiku Stairs situation is to remove the temptation, remove the stairs.

I strongly oppose this resolution to remove the Ha'iku Stairs at least until the City puts out a requests for proposals (hereinafter "RFP") and the City and the people of Hawaii are allowed to assess the prospect of removal against privately funded plans to resolve all of the issues associated with the Ha'iku Stairs.

This RFI submitted by the City was the first step on the public private partnership procurement route that the City then contemplated.

The Haiku Stairs is likely the biggest international attraction to Hawaii and has the potential to attract tens of millions of dollars in visitor money annually. Removing just a portion of the Ha'iku Stairs would cost the City an estimated \$1,000,000.00. Furthermore, this removal would not stop access to the top of the Ha'iku Stairs. History has proven that when enforcement of and penalties for trespassing from the Ha'iku access point is increased, it reduces trespassing in Ha'iku but has little if any effect on trespassing to access the top of the Ha'iku Stairs from alternate routes. Of even greater concern is the HFD spokesperson pointed out at the City Council hearing on May 11, 2021, rescues from the alternate routes nearly double the number of rescues from the Ha'iku Stairs.

CR-212 grossly understates the opposition to removing the Haiku Stairs. Buried at the very end is a brief mention of the THOUSANDS of people who oppose removal, and who want to legally be able to use, the stairs. I strongly oppose Resolution 21-154 to remove the Haiku Stairs and restrict access to public land. Elected officials should clearly be representing the broader community who want the stairs and who significantly outnumber those seeking removal. This shortsighted action to remove the stairs is favoring a small group of private interests over the greater public good.

Written Testimony Historic and current practices in Hawaii have provided for common access to public land and water. Beach and mountain access easements are located all over the island in between houses, and there are even special allowances to pass through gated communities to reach mountain hike trailheads. The ability for all to enjoy the island's natural resources, regardless of whether you have the good fortune to own property next to these public amenities, is what sets Hawaii and Oahu apart.

There are around 1 million residents (not to mention all the tourists) on Oahu, and only a small fraction live around the Haiku Stairs. As our island becomes more crowded, we should be creating/improving access to as much of the public land as possible to allow for some respite and enjoyment of the very land owned and supported by taxpayers. Removing Haiku Stairs runs counter to this objective, and it's very shortsighted to outright dismiss the obviously greater good of such a public amenity that is already known to be highly desirable and cherished.

Of perhaps greater concern, this resolution could create a slippery slope where other select property owners near public amenities around the island will subsequently find cause to challenge the public's access rights near their residence just because it inconveniences them. Recall that the City Council has previously supported the greater good, including past condemnation of an easement that opened up beach access in Portlock just this year. It defies reason why the community around Haiku Stairs should get special treatment from these public access standards to make our public land more accessible.

Please direct your efforts to figuring out viable solutions for a managed and safe access to the stairs, which can still respect the nearby residents' wellbeing, and defer this resolution. There are plenty of people willing to assist.

Chair Waters and members of the City Council, mahalo for the opportunity to submit testimony on behalf of the Hawai'i Lodging & Tourism Association, the state's largest private sector visitor industry organization.

The Hawai'i Lodging & Tourism Association—nearly 700 members strong, representing more than 50,000 hotel rooms and nearly 40,000 lodging workers—strongly supports the removal of the Haiku Stairs, also commonly known as the Stairway to Heaven.

To this day, we are all well aware of the myriad negative issues surrounding the illegal, but popular, hike on the Windward side: trespassing through local neighborhoods, illegal parking, and the sheer threat it serves to both hikers and emergency personnel. During my tenure as the mayor of Honolulu, I had made the decision to close off the stairs to the public in consultation with my Fire Department Chief and other first responders who expressed grave concerns of the danger we would be placing on their teams, and the lives we would be putting at risk to run rescue missions.

If you go to You Tube website and enter Haiku Stairway to Heaven there are several videos from various people climbing the stairway, I guess the stairway is being advertised to the tourist visiting Oahu and they can be escorted up the stairway with a guide, the stairway was also given as a prize on the Price is Right gameshow!

So much for the stairway being off limits, the special interest groups who want to keep the stairway open and intact are not listening to the issues from the residents, we are the ones that have to suffer the consequences of the hikers parking all over the street and trespass through some of the homes to get to the stairway. If that is the case, than tear down the stairway and have the hikers climb up to the top through other legal access ways.

Even if the Haiku Stairway will be controlled by a contractor during normal daylight hours, the hikers that do not want to pay a fee to hike the stairway are still going to access the trail during the early morning hours like they are doing right now. Our elected officials are finally standing up to the communities concerns and making it difficult for special interest groups trying to influence our elected officials. This issue of removing the Haiku Stairway has gone on for so long, please listen to the concerns of the Kaneohe neighborhood. Thank you for standing up to the communities concerns!

URGING THE CITY ADMINISTRATION TO REMOVE THE HAIKŪ STAIRS AND ITS ACCESSORY STRUCTURES TO STOP TRESPASSING, REDUCE DISTURBANCES TO LOCAL NEIGHBORHOODS, INCREASE PUBLIC SAFETY, REMOVE POTENTIAL LIABILITY TO THE CITY, AND PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT.

Position:

I oppose this Resolution.

I lived closest to the gate at the end of Kuneki Street in Haikū, Kāne'ohe, of all your testifiers.

Every night, I was woken up between midnight and 3 a.m., to the slamming car doors, the headlights beaming through my window curtains, from the breaking of glass, the car alarms, the police sirens, the yelling and arguments between hikers and residents. This is a preventable tragedy. The political class of Hawai'i has inflicted this state of affairs on the residents of Makena Street, Kuneki Street, Makena Place, Kuneki Place, and Puulau Place for far too long. So why am I opposed to the resolution?

I oppose this resolution because we can solve the residents' issues, and keep the stairs. It pains me that this resolution, introduced by a kind and otherwise thoughtful member of the Council, does neither.

Anytime the cash-strapped City and County of Honolulu spends hundreds of thousands of dollars to refurbish a piece of world-famous infrastructure, only to spend \$1 million to destroy it a few years later, amidst the backdrop of a city budget crisis, it is clear that we have <u>failed</u> politics.

As with the Stairs, our City wastes vast sums of money, though it is has scarce little. First, consider the ridiculous, \$150,000 robot-dog for the Police Department. Second, there's the money to shuffle the homeless around, accomplishing nothing other than further traumatization. Third, there's the rail, built over-budget and offensively behind schedule, in the most backwards, improbable manner. Fourth, consider the crook that the City put in charge of administering the CARES Act funds (see: police, robot-dog), because we often award jobs in Honolulu on the basis of patronage or family, instead of competence and service to the little people. Fifth, think of repeatedly vandalized public parks and bathrooms, where criminals smash porcelain toilets, mirrors, doors, and steal soap dispensers. Rather than installing cameras and rounding up the tiny handful of vandals through detection, surveillance, and tough enforcement, we incinerate hundreds of thousands of dollars on replacing smashed and stolen infrastructure. We keep our parks in such a sorry state, that parents should be either frightened or ashamed to let their children play unsupervised in these.

Anytime a legislative policy pits the homeowners against hikers, it's a red flag that a narcissistic manipulator is hijacking our politics. We urban planners talk about Not-In-My-Back-Yard-ism (NIMBYism). Economists call it zero-sum, because no one wins. Tear-down-the-Stairs' is both. I know exactly who has fostered a City of bad politics and patronage for decades, specifically on the Haikū Stairs. That so-called 'thought-leader' doesn't live anywhere near as close to the gate as I did. Thanks to her influence, we have managers of Haikū Stairs and no leaders. Claim the 'Leader' title for yourself, with all its benefits. The only sacrifice you must make is that you must act like one, and

do more difficult work then running away from the problem when residents or wannabe political kingmakers get mad.

Bring real solutions on Haikū Stairs, not zero-sum policies. Here's one solution for you to use. Open the Stairs daily, for 10 hours during daylight hours only, for access by permit reservation with liability waiver only. Close the Stairs at night, and maintain guard presence throughout the closure period.

Currently, we guard the Stairs in the morning, and send a giant message to the whole world to just come at night.

This solution eliminates <u>all</u> the nightly noise and light, the nightly parking overflow, the nightly fights, like I had to endure. It regulates parking demand so that the residents are not unduly burdened. In exchange, you provide hiker access, preserve the City's status as a world-class destination, cover the City's liability, and provide revenues for infrastructure maintenance and ecosystem preservation. You will protect the residents' quality of life, like you are supposed to.

You know who thought this policy up, originally? An environmental economist, someone who worked in the field of win-win policies. She has been woken up every night for decades because of what the City has done with the Stairs, has done to her, and to taxpayers like us. I think she's right. This resolution is wrong. Yes, her idea has issues to work out. All real solutions do, where people make compromises that they'd rather forego. Come up with a better one if you can.

Tearing the Stairs down is an abdication of leadership. It is no solution, only a moral and public policy failure. You can do better. I have faith in you, and faith that in the end, the truth will continue to come out when corrupt and negligent mismanagement of the City occurs.

Aloha kākou, my name is Holly Sevier. I have lived in Ha'ikū valley for 17 years and have served as neighborhood board member for nine of those years. In 2017 the Board voted unanimously in support of reopening the Stairs under a managed access plan.

Since the City & County of Honolulu are on the point of making the Ha'ikū Stairs history, I'd like to speak today to the unique history of how the Ha'ikū Stairs came into being.

After Pearl Harbor was attacked in 1941 and the US joined the war, the US Navy became determined to engineer a way to provide communications to their fleet across the Pacific. For sailors and submariners as far away as Tokyo Bay, these communications meant life and death and so an engineering feat unmatched in communications history was needed.

> Looking at the unique horseshoe-shaped topography of Ha'ikū Valley with its steep valley walls rising up to a height of between 2-3 thousand feet all around, the Navy realized they could use the valley itself as a signal amplifier, if only they could scale those steep walls and anchor the antenna into place.

And so for 21 days, two young high-scalers named Bill Adams and Louis Otto were contracted to scale the steep pali up to the peak of Pu'u Keahiakahoe, driving spikes into the rock and pulling themselves up on ropes as they went. When they reached the top, anchors were put into place that then allowed antennae to be strung across the entire 3,000 width of the valley.

With the groundbreaking Alexanderson Alternator in place in the bomb-proof transmitter building in the base of the valley, radio signals could now reach ships and submarines in Japan.

There is only one remaining Alexanderson Alternator left in the world, the one in our valley having been partially destroyed by vandals after the Navy left. Don't let the City and County of Honolulu destroy the rest of this pioneering world-famous communications system. Save the Ha'ikū Stairs.

I am a Kailua resident, born and raised in the east side, and I strongly oppose the resolution to remove the Ha'iku Stairs. The people of Hawaii have expressed an overwhelming opposition to the removal of the Ha'iku Stairs. In the last City Council meeting in which testimony on this issue was accepted, 92.7% of the submitted testimony was in opposition to removal. The vast majority of 7.3% of the testimony that supported removal was submitted by parents of current students and alumni from Ke Kula o' Samuel M. Kamakau (hereinafter "Kamakau"). This opposition, however, was premised on the erroneous belief that the alternative to removal is to do nothing and leave things as they are. I strongly oppose this resolution to remove the Ha'iku Stairs at least until the City puts out a requests for proposals (hereinafter "RFP") and the City and the people of Hawaii are allowed to assess the prospect of removal against privately funded plans to resolve all of the issues associated with the Ha'iku Stairs.

Written Testimony There is very wide opposition to the contemplated removal of the Ha'iku Stairs. At the last City Council meeting held on May 11, 2021 and per Bill Higgs from the Friends of Ha'iku Stairs who claims to have read through and counted each one of the 1365 pieces of written testimony, 92.7% (or 1265 of 1365) of the submitted written testimony was in opposition to removal of the Ha'iku Stairs. This is understandable, the Haiku Stairs are a huge international draw that was featured in the National Geographic article, "World's Best Hikes: Endangered Trails" as one of the top 10 endangered trails in the world.

The vast majority of the 7.4% (100 of 1365) of the written testimony submitted in support of the resolution to remove the Ha'iku Stairs was submitted by alumni or parents of current students of Kamakau. It is entirely understandable that the parents of students, alumni, and faculty of Kamakau are the strongest supporters of removal. Kamakau sits next to the main access point to the Ha'iku Stairs and at least arguably is the most impacted by the Ha'iku Stairs. While the impact to Kamakau is of serious concern and needs to be addressed, all of the submitted testimony in support of removal is premised on the proposition that the alternative is to do nothing and leave things as they are. This is an entirely inaccurate

proposition. No one wants to leave things as they are.

There are at least 14 private entities that have expressed an interest in attempting to resolve all of the problems associated with the Ha'iku Stairs - paramount of which must be reducing or eliminating the impact on Kamakau and the broader Ha'iku community. On or about February 11, 2020, the Department of Enterprise Services put our a request for information (hereinafter "RFI"). This RFI asked private operators questions about the procurement structure, financial/commercial feasibility, technical feasibility, and other issues surrounding a concession at the Ha'iku Stairs. Unseen Hawai'i Adventure Tours, LLC and 13 other potential operators submitted responses to the Department of Enterprise Services RFI on or before February 28, 2020 at 4:00PM. This RFI also explicitly stated, however, that a private parties failure to submit an RFI on February 28, 2020 did not preclude it from entering this contemplated public private partnership procurement process at a later stage. This RFI submitted by the City was the first step on the public private partnership procurement route that the City then contemplated.

The Haiku Stairs is likely the biggest international attraction to Hawaii and has the potential to attract tens of millions of dollars in visitor money annually. Removing just a portion of the Ha'iku Stairs would cost the City an estimated \$1,000,000.00. Furthermore, this removal would not stop access to the top of the Ha'iku Stairs. History has proven that when enforcement of and penalties for trespassing from the Ha'iku access point is increased, it reduces trespassing in Ha'iku but has little if any effect on trespassing to access the top of the Ha'iku Stairs from alternate routes. Of even greater concern is the HFD spokesperson pointed out at the City Council hearing on May 11, 2021, rescues from the alternate routes nearly double the number of rescues from the Ha'iku Stairs.

Particularly because 1) the people of Hawaii have expressed overwhelming opposition to the removal of the Ha'iku Stairs and 2) at best removal of the Ha'iku Stairs would have the questionable effect of pushing nuisance issues from one community to another, and increasing safety concerns, I strongly oppose this resolution to remove the Haiku Stairs - at least until a RFP can be conducted to consider the alternatives to removal.
