RESOLUTION

RELATING TO THE APPOINTMENT OF ARUSHI KUMAR AS THE CITY AUDITOR.

WHEREAS, Section 3-501, Revised Charter of the City and County of Honolulu (Amended 2017 Edition), as amended ("Charter"), establishes within the City's legislative branch an Office of the City Auditor ("Office"), headed by a City Auditor who is exempt from civil service and is appointed by the City Council ("Council") to serve a six-year term; and

WHEREAS, Charter Section 3-501 requires that the City Auditor "possess adequate professional proficiency for the [O]ffice, demonstrated by relevant certification, such as certification as a certified internal auditor or certified public accountant, or have an advanced degree in a relevant field with at least five years experience in the field of government auditing, evaluation, or analysis"; and

WHEREAS, Charter Section 3-501 additionally requires the City Auditor to have a bachelor's degree in "accounting, business administration, or public administration or related field" and expresses a preference for a certified internal auditor or a certified public accountant; and

WHEREAS, Charter Section 3-501 also requires that, if financial statement audits are conducted, the City Auditor "shall be a certified public accountant"; and

WHEREAS, the previous City Auditor was appointed by the Council by Resolution 10-75 for a six-year term commencing on May 1, 2010, and expiring on April 30, 2016, and was reappointed by the Council by Resolution 16-98 for a second sixyear term commencing on May 1, 2016, and expiring on April 30, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the previous City Auditor stepped down from the position on January 31, 2019, which required the Council to appoint a new City Auditor, and the Office has since been directed and managed by an Acting Auditor; and

WHEREAS, although a 2019 special auditor search committee, established by the Council through Resolution 19-17, recommended the current Acting City Auditor for the position of City Auditor, the recommendation was conditioned upon the Acting City Auditor obtaining a certificate as a Certified Internal Auditor or a Certified Public Accountant by a certain deadline, which was later extended; and

WHEREAS, because a certificate was not obtained by the extended deadline, the Council established a new special auditor search committee ("2021 Search



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Committee") via Resolution 21-52, composed of Councilmember Calvin Say, Councilmember Radiant Cordero, Ms. Patricia Mau-Shimizu, and Ms. Natalie Iwasa; and

WHEREAS, the 2021 Search Committee was charged with:

- (1) Soliciting or recruiting qualified applicants for the position of City Auditor;
- (2) Investigating the qualifications of and interviewing the applicants; and
- (3) Making findings and recommendations based on the investigation to the Council; and

WHEREAS, in April and May of 2021, the 2021 Search Committee advertised the vacancy for the City Auditor position in the Honolulu Star-Advertiser, on Monster.com, and on relevant websites, including websites for the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners Hawaii Chapter, the Association of Government Accountants Hawaii Chapter, the Association of Internal Auditors Hawaii Chapter, the Hawaii Society of Certified Public Accountants, and the Hawaii Association of Professional Accountants; and

WHEREAS, 19 applications were received for the City Auditor position by the application deadline of June 4, 2021, and all applicant submissions were forwarded to the 2021 Search Committee members for review; and

WHEREAS, between July 19, 2021 and July 26, 2021, the 2021 Search Committee interviewed the top 13 candidates for the City Auditor position; and

WHEREAS, on July 28, 2021, using scoring criteria established to ensure consistency and fairness, the 2021 Search Committee narrowed down the list of candidates to the top five finalists for a second round of interviews; and

WHEREAS, on August 9, 2021, the 2021 Search Committee conducted a second round of interviews with three of the finalists, after two finalists withdrew from consideration; and

WHEREAS, following the interviews, the 2021 Search Committee discussed the qualifications, background, experience, and personal strengths of the three finalists and narrowed the field to one recommended applicant, Ms. Arushi Kumar, pending a review of her references; and



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WHEREAS, a copy of Ms. Kumar's resume is attached as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, based upon the qualifications for the City Auditor established by Charter, and following a thorough evaluation of the educational background and work experience of the applicants, the 2021 Search Committee recommended Ms. Kumar for the position of City Auditor for a term to commence on December 1, 2021; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City and County of Honolulu that Arushi Kumar be and hereby is appointed to serve as the City Auditor for a six-year term commencing December 1, 2021; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be transmitted to Arushi Kumar.
