### FOR ACTION

- 1. **<u>RESOLUTION 21-239</u> ACCEPTANCE OF A GIFT.** Accepting a gift to the City of equipment, labor, waste disposal, and food valued at \$3,900 from Domino's Hawaii for the clean up of the area around Waipahu Elementary School.
- <u>RESOLUTION 21-246</u> ACCEPTANCE OF A GIFT (DPR). Accepting a gift of four (4) murals valued at \$20,000 to the City from POW! WOW! to be painted at Sandy Beach Park Comfort Station #2 (Makapuu side) in memory of Joy Mills-Ferren and Joshua "Goat" Guerra. (Transmitted by Communication <u>D-701</u>)
- 3. <u>RESOLUTION 21-247</u> APPROVING A MEMORIAL MURAL AT SANDY BEACH PARK COMFORT STATION #2. Requesting approval of a memorial mural in honor of Joy Mills-Ferren and Joshua "Goat" Guerra at Sandy Beach Park Comfort Station #2. (Transmitted by Communication <u>D-701</u>)
- 4. **RESOLUTION 21-211 ESTABLISHING A 24/7 HELPLINE FOR CITY PARKS.** Requesting the Department of Parks and Recreation to establish a 24 hours-aday, seven days-a-week, Helpline for residents to submit requests for evening and weekend emergency maintenance, repairs, and clean-ups at City parks, and ensuring there is sufficient staff available to respond to requests.
- <u>BILL 34 (2021)</u> RELATING TO COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES AT PUBLIC PARKS. Addresses commercial activities at certain beach parks to include Sunset Beach Park, Haleiwa Beach Park, and Haleiwa Alii Beach Park; and at city owned or operated beach rights-of-way and easements to include from Sunset Point to Kaiaka Point. (Bill passed First Reading on 8/11/2021)

<u>PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 34 (2021)</u> (Submitted by Councilmember Tsuneyoshi) – The CD1 (OCS2021-0936/10/11/2021 4:00 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. Exempts commercial filming activities from the restrictions on commercial activities at Sunset Beach Park, Haleiwa Beach Park, and Haleiwa Alii Beach Park.
- B. Amends the language of the sections on commercial activity at parks to improve clarity and conformity.

- C. Adds as an exemption to the "grandfather" clause (SECTION 6 of the bill) applicable permits that may have been issued for commercial activities at Sunset Beach Park, Haleiwa Beach Park, Haleiwa Alii Beach Park, and certain City rights-of-way, for those permits that are revoked for violation of their own terms or of the ordinances or rules in effect at the time of their issuance.
- D. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
- 6. <u>BILL 38 (2021)</u> RELATING TO COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES AT PUBLIC PARKS. Addresses commercial activities at certain beach parks to include Makapuu Beach Park, Kaupo Beach Park, Kaiona Beach Park, Waimanalo Beach Park, Hūnānāniho, and Bellows Field Beach Park; and at city owned or operated beach rights-of-way and easements from Makapuu Point to Kapoho Point (Castle Point) instead of from Lanikai to Kapoho Point. (Bill passed First Reading on 10/6/21)
