[Overall] Conceptual Development Pattern on O'ahu. Amend to: "OAHU GENERAL PLAN" is a good compromise – (Note that the Oahu General Plan has 8 communities plans under it. Some are Sustainable Communities Plan and some are Development Plans. To be equitable to the entire Oahu, it should not be only focused on the "Development" context only. SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITIES concept must be an integral part of this over-arching plan.)

Amend Figure 3 to be consistent with Exhibit 1-1 in the East Honolulu Sustainable Communities Plan (Ordinance 21-11), which removes portions of the Kaiwi Coastline from appearing as urban fringe.

In the legend, DELETE add a white rectangle to indicate "NonDesignated Area." This contributes to confusion to the public. DPP is inconsistent in providing "non-designated area" markings to the entire Oahu map. Does DPP wish to remain conceptual or does it wish to be more specific which requires much more attention and work?

In the legend and map, change middle gray-scale colors to patterns to more readily distinguish the different development areas.




RESO 21-23 Oahu General Plan Concepts

Map #1 is the EXISTING MAP that has been in the 2002 Oahu General Plan. It provides clear concepts of both the 8 separate **Development** and **Sustainable** Communities Plan for the entire Oahu.




General Plan Development Pattern



MAP #2 is DPP's latest proposed map. There were various versions in 2017, April 2021, September 2021 and this one in November 2021. DPP insists that the Oahu General Plan is not regulatory document and that it's into "CONCEPTUAL" policies.

Preserving the RURAL CORRIDOR is exactly that. It's conceptual. Its concepts of diversification, sustainability, food resiliency, open space, farmlands, food sustainability, watersheds, Oahu's beauty and so forth are all conceptualized in this rural region. But, DPP created gaps that confuses the Rural Corridor. DPP calls its revised white Gaps as "Non-Designated Areas" which is confusing because this principle is not applied throughout ALL the Oahu areas.




MAP #2

MAP #3 is the **grassroots residents** proposed Sustainable Map, including clarifications in red letters. We suggest retaining **PRIMARY URBAN CENTER**, rather than Urbanized Area (PUC). Those polled thought PUC was Public Ulitilies Commission.


The city's **PUC – Primary Urban Center** – is almost an inhouse acronymn known to only a few.

"Non-Designated Area" was particulary confusing to all. Even 2 cartographers we talked with were confused.

MAP #3 Please Adopt this MAP.



Map 3b reflects the **restoration of the Rural Corridor (No Gaps)** to DPP's November 2021 Revised Map. This was completed by a young woman in the Ko'olau Loa. We're told that DPP is not using a cartographer but a worker is applying his/her best efforts. We're happy to work with DPP, if needed.

MAP #4 is a GIS Map that shows Oahu being occupied by about 50% by the Ko'olau Loa/Ko'olau Poko Range and the Waianae Range. The Oahu General Plan, under the leadership of Governor George Ariyoshi in the 1970s realized that our island home needs strong and wise leadership to protect Hawaii's sense of place, sustainability, happiness and the general welfare into the future.

COVID19 has taught us much. We must not turn the entire Oahu into a big parking lot. We must protect diversified environment, resources, and economy. The City Council has through the years recognized the need to the *Keep The Country Country values* and have supported these values/concepts as part of the over-arching plan for Oahu.


Map #5 is a SPOOF map sent by a grassroots resident. Please do not read any more into it than it's a satire.
