- <u>RESOLUTION 22-4</u> NOMINATION OF ROGER W. BABCOCK, JR. Confirming the nomination of Roger W. Babcock, Jr., P.E., Ph.D., to serve as the Director of the Department of Environmental Services of the City and County of Honolulu. (Transmitted by Communication <u>MM-189(21)</u>; Public hearing held 1/26/22)
- <u>RESOLUTION 22-18</u> ACCEPTANCE OF GIFT (DTS). Accepting a gift to the City from Trust for Public Land for the installation and upkeep of eight decorative "mini" murals, valued at \$8,500, to adorn traffic control boxes and bus stops around 'A'Ala Park. (Transmitted by Communication <u>D-57</u>)
- 3. <u>BILL 50 (2021)</u> DISPOSAL OF WEEDS, GARBAGE, TRASH, AND WASTE FROM PROPERTY. Relating to the disposal of weeds, garbage, trash, and waste from property. (Bill passed first reading on 1/26/22)
- 4. <u>BILL 43 (2021)</u> AMPLIFIED SOUND IN WAIKIKI. Preserving the tranquility of Waikiki against noise disturbances by regulating amplified sound from public property in that area. (Bill passed first reading on 11/10/21)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 43 (2021) (Submitted by Councilmember Cordero) – The CD1 (OCS2022-0060/2/1/2022 7:49 AM) makes the following amendments:

- A. In SECTION 2, exempts "[p]icketing activities involved in an employee strike or other labor dispute for the purpose of collective bargaining" from the amplified sound restrictions.
- B. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.

5. <u>BILL 48 (2021), CD1</u> – UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANKS. Relating to underground storage tanks. (Bill passed second reading and public hearing held 1/26/22)

PROPOSED CD2 TO BILL 48 (2021), CD1 (Submitted by Council Chair Waters) – The CD2 (OCS2022-0084/2/1/2022 1:43 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. Creates a requirement for the owner or operator of any UST or UST system with a capacity to store more than 100,000 gallons of any regulated substance that is in operation on the effective date of the ordinance to apply for a permit if it desires to continue operations.
- B. Removes the provision that the standard for granting or renewal of a UST permit will be whether the system will be protective of human health and the environment, and replaces the standard with the requirement that the applicant must demonstrate that the UST or UST system will not leak into the environment during its operating life.
- C. Amends the provisions relating to the term of a permit to provide for a term to be specified in the permit (but not to exceed five years), rather than for an automatic five-year term.
- D. Removes the provision that the standard for revoking a permit for a release or threatened release of regulated substances requires the department to first deem that such release poses an imminent and substantial risk to human health or the environment.
- E. Removes provisions relating to the permittee's obligation to notify the department of all changes in information relating to a UST. Retains the requirement that a permittee must report evidence of any release of a regulated substance.
- F. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.

6. <u>Bill 46 (2021)</u> – CAR-SHARING VEHICLES. Relating to car-sharing vehicles. (Bill passed first reading on 12/1/21)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 46 (2021) (Submitted by Council Chair Waters) – The CD1 (OCS2022-0039/1/19/2022 12:39 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. Amends ROH Section 15-16(b) in SECTION 2 of the bill to add a new exception to the prohibition against storage parking of commercial vehicles for more than four hours on any public street under ROH Section 15-16(a) for "[v]ehicles having a valid sticker for a reserved car-sharing on-street parking stall designated by the director of transportation services pursuant to Section 15-28.1(b)(2)."
- B. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
