- A. In the third WHEREAS clause, clarifies that:
 - 1. The DPP transmitted its findings and recommendation of approval to the City Council on January 10, 2022 (as opposed to December 17, 2021), within 32 (as opposed to 20) working days after the close of the public hearing; and
 - 2. The Applicant had agreed to an extension of the 20-working-day administrative deadline pursuant to ROH Section 25-5.4.
- B. In the fourth WHEREAS clause, specifies the date of receipt and the communication number of the departmental communication from the DPP that transmitted the Resolution to the Council.
