L. 117-2) shall be appropriated to establish a death benefits program for Honolulu residents who are citizens of the Freely Associated States who were not eligible for the Federal Emergency Management Administration death benefits reimbursement program."		\$1,999,000	CE		This amendment increases the CD1 approved amendment by \$1,999,000. Though only 4% of the State population, Pacific Islanders have the third most deaths from COVID-19, making up roughly 17% of the entire death count. Due to Federal Law, citizens of Freely Associated States are unable to benefit from FEMAs COVID-19 Funeral Assistance program that is open to US citizens, non-citizen nationals, and qualified non-citizens. If accepted, this amendment would right a wrong that was created at the Federal level and provide an invaluable assistance and support to our Micronesian residents.

In the past, lack of sufficient communication and coordination between the City and the State Historic Preservation Division have resulted in the desecration and demolition of 'iwi kupuna and valuable properties. Having an informed archaeologist on staff would provide in-house expertise for the Department to assist with identifying when actions may warrant further or additional review, communicating with SHPD, and making informed decisions so that DPP can efficiently execute their kuleana.

L. 117-2) shall be appropriated to establish a Home Ownership Assistance Grant Program to support households and communities impacted or disproportionately impacted by the coronavirus pandemic."	\$10,000,000	CE	FG Final Treasury Rule allows use of ARPA FRF "to further support sustainable and durable homeownership," and allows recipients to offer "down payment assistance, such as through contributions to a homeowner's equity at origination or that establish a post-closing, mortgage reserve account on behalf of the borrower that may be utilized to make a missed or partial mortgage payment at any point during the life of the loan[.]" "Homeownership assistance that would be eligible under the Community Development Block Grant (at 24 CFR 507.201(n)) is also an eligible use of SLFRF funds." If average award is \$20,000, it would serve approx. 500 households; or 1,000 households if average award is \$10,000. This program is different from the City's existing Down Payment Loan Program as these funds will be disbursed in the manner of grants not loans.

Utilization of funding from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. 117-2) for addressing the impacts of the pandemic on disproportionately impacted households or communities through 1) rehabilitation, renovation, maintenance or costs to secure vacant or abandoned properties to reduce their negative impact; 2) costs associated with acquiring and securing legal title of vacant or abandoned properties and other costs to position the property for current or future productive use; 3) removal and remediation of environmental contaminants or hazards from vacant or abandoned properties; 4) demolition or deconstruction of abandoned buildings (including residential, commercial, or industrial buildings) paired with greening or other lot improvement as a part of strategy for neighborhood revitalization; 5) conversion of vacant or abandoned properties to affordable housing, greening or cleanup of vacant lots, as well as other efforts to make vacant lots safer for surrounding community; 6) or inspection fees and other administrative costs incurred to ensure compliance with applicable environmental laws and regulations for demolition, greening, or other remediation activities.
