VIEWING THE MEETING

Viewers who experience a loss of viewing signal should try switching to another viewing option.

ORAL TESTIMONY

Oral testimony will be permitted on all items on the agenda, subject to the following restrictions:

Each speaker may not have anyone else read their statement and is limited to a one-minute presentation.

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Remote Testimony

- 1. Persons may submit oral testimony remotely through the Zoom video conferencing platform. To participate, persons should visit <u>https://hnldoc.ehawaii.gov/hnldoc/testimony</u>. Videoconference access information will be provided upon submission of testimony/registration. Zoom testifiers are strongly encouraged to register at least 24 hours before the start of the meeting.

In-Person Testimony in the Council Chamber

Persons may also submit oral testimony in the Council Chamber.

Persons wishing to testify are requested to register by 10:30 a.m. by filling out the registration form in person outside the Council Chamber. Persons who have not registered will be given an opportunity to speak following the oral testimonies of the registered speakers.

Members of the public entering the Council Chamber are requested to spead themselves out. If the Chamber becomes crowded, members of the public may be requested to wait outside the Chamber until called to testify.

All oral testimony, both remote and in-person, will be taken at the start of the agenda and then closed, in the following order:

- 1. Remote testimony will be taken first and then closed;
- 2. In-person testimony in the Council Chamber will be taken second and then closed.
