<u>PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 25 (2022)</u> (Submitted by Councilmember Tupola) – The CD1 (OCS2022-0509/6/15/2022 2:08 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. In SECTION 2, restores stricken language from ROH Section 3-13.4 ("..., or, if the registrant is a person other than an individual, by an appropriate officer of such registrant.") to avoid any conflict with provisions of ROH Section 3-13.3(b).
- B. In a new SECTION 3, revises ROH Section 3-13.5 to conform with the amendments to ROH Section 3-13.4 in SECTION 2, by striking the phrase "under oath as true and correct" from ROH Section 3-13.5(a). Renumbers subsequent SECTIONS.
- C. Makes miscellaneous technical and non-substantive amendments.

4. <u>BILL 26 (2022)</u> – RELATING TO GIFTS. Clarifying gifts to the Mayor, the Prosecuting Attorney, Councilmembers, and City Officers and employees. (Transmitted by Communication <u>D-267</u>; Bill passed first reading 5/4/22)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 26 (2022) (Submitted by Councilmember Tupola) – The CD1 (OCS2022-0510/6/15/2022 4:16 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. In SECTION 2, removes the definition of "Officer or employee" from ROH Section 3-8.7(a), as it is already defined in ROH Section 3-8.1, which is applicable to the entirety of ROH Chapter 3, Article 8.
- B. In SECTION 2, revises the exemption proposed under ROH Section 3-8.7(d)(11) to clarify that "negligible value" applies to the lei, not the celebration.
- C. Makes miscellaneous technical and non-substantive amendments.
