RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZING THE USE OF OVERT VIDEO MONITORING IN THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU IN CAMPBELL INDUSTRIAL PARK TO PREVENT AND DETER GENERAL CRIMINAL ACTIVITY.

WHEREAS, Section 2-32.1, Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990 ("ROH") defines "overt monitoring" as monitoring of which a reasonable person would be aware; and

WHEREAS, ROH Section 2-32.1 defines "legitimate law enforcement objective" as the detection, investigation, prevention or deterrence of crime, protection of a person or property from harm, or the apprehension and prosecution of a suspected criminal or traffic violator; and

WHEREAS, ROH Section 2-32.1 defines "legitimate public purpose" as the detection, investigation, prevention or deterrence of violations of federal, State or City and County of Honolulu ("City") regulatory requirements, the evaluation of City programs and operations, the training of City personnel, the investigation of claims involving the City, and other activities supporting public functions; and

WHEREAS, ROH Section 2-32.3(a)(6) provides for the use of overt video monitoring of public activity by the City from fixed locations for purposes as designated by the City Council ("Council") via resolution, following the holding of a public hearing at which members of the public may express their views on the proposed monitoring and the proposed general areas where the monitoring will take place; and

WHEREAS, the Honolulu Police Department ("HPD") and other City departments currently utilize video surveillance cameras for the prevention and deterrence of criminal activity at various locations within the City, including but not limited to Waikīkī and downtown Honolulu; and

WHEREAS, video surveillance cameras are also used by the Department of Transportation Services to monitor traffic and by the Department of Information Technology to monitor entry points to, and equipment located in and around, public buildings or facilities; and

WHEREAS, Campbell Industrial Park in Kapolei is the largest industrial park in Hawai'i, with nearly 250 industrial and commercial businesses occupying approximately 1,380 acres in total: and

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, according to recent media coverage, businesses in Campbell Industrial Park have suffered from repeated burglaries from thieves who time their activities to minimize detection or interruption by the HPD, security guards, and other business employees; and

WHEREAS, businesses in Campbell Industrial Park have undertaken significant and costly surveillance and security upgrades, but continue to be the target of repeated thefts; and

WHEREAS, Campbell Industrial Park businesses and community members are attempting to coordinate and establish a community patrol or conduct additional electronic monitoring in an attempt to reduce the number of thefts; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that use of video monitoring for the prevention and deterrence of crime in Campbell Industrial Park is in the best interest of the City and that some of the City's video surveillance cameras could potentially be redeployed for this purpose; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City and County of Honolulu that it authorizes the Honolulu Police Department and its designees to install monitoring overt video monitoring equipment and conduct overt video monitoring at various locations in the City in Campbell Industrial Park to achieve the legitimate law enforcement objective and legitimate public purpose of ensuring the safety of business in Campbell Industrial Park, as well as the general public; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the provisions of this resolution take effect upon the adoption of this Resolution and upon compliance with the noticing requirements as provided in Sections 2-32.3(b)(5) and 2-32.3(b)(6), Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Honolulu Police Department must submit an annual report as provided in Section 2-32.3(b)(8), Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990; and
