Aloha Chair Waters and members of the Honolulu City Council,

Mahalo for the opportunity to submit testimony on behalf of Hale Kipa, Inc., in strong support of Resolution 22-199. Since 2002, Hale Kipa has leased the City's Special Needs Housing site at 1828 Makuahine Street in Kalihi. We seek to renew this lease with the City & County of Honolulu to continue to provide emergency shelter to youth, ages 12-17. Our shelters are open to youth who have been abused, or are neglected, homeless, or facing a personal crisis. Hale Kipa offers 24-hour support, 7-days a week. A Case Manager works with the residents on a weekly basis. Hale Kipa's Facilities Manager ensures that the home is kept in good repair.

Founded in 1970, Hale Kipa has focused on the needs of children and youth and has grown from its humble beginnings as an emergency shelter for females on Oahu to become a statewide, nationally accredited agency with 20 programs responsive to the ongoing needs of Hawaii's high-risk youth and young adults, ages 5-27, and their families. Hale Kipa's vision is that youth and families will be able to thrive at their fullest potential while being socially responsible humans; its mission is to *provide opportunities and environments that strengthen and encourage youth, their families, and communities to actualize their potential and social responsibility*. We accomplish this through a

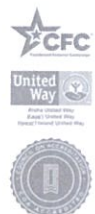
