2. **BILL 44 (2022) – OAHU HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION.** Amending the ordinance relating to the Oahu Historic Preservation Commission. (Bill passed second reading and public hearing held 10/5/22)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 44 (2022) (Submitted by Councilmember Kia'āina) – The Proposed CD1 (OCS2022-0811/10/11/2022 10:21 AM) makes the following amendments:

A. In SECTION 5 of the bill:

1. Deletes ROH subsection 3-10.7(g) in its entirety and realphabetizes subsequent subsections accordingly;
2. Amends realphabetized ROH subsection 3-10.7(j) to provide that the Historic Preservation Commission may review and comment on:
  - (1) Archaeological reports and cultural impact assessments submitted to the Department of Planning and Permitting (DPP) as part of development proposal applications; and
  - (2) Proposed projects upon request from DPP, including projects located on historic properties identified in the O'ahu historic property system.

B. Makes miscellaneous technical and non-substantive amendments.
