PROPOSED CD1 TO RESOLUTION 22-236 (Submitted by Councilmember Tupola) – The CD1 (OCS2022-0846/10/25/2022 10:42 am) makes the following amendments:

- A. Amends the title of the Resolution to read as follows:
 - "RESOLUTION URGING THE HAWAI'I STATE LEGISLATURE TO ENACT LEGISLATION TO ALLOCATE FIFTY PERCENT OF THE REVENUES FROM TRAFFIC FINES AND FORFEITURES TO THE COUNTIES FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES."
- B. Rearranges and revises various WHEREAS clauses to emphasize the importance of obtaining funding for the counties, the cost of enforcement, and to provide further details relating to the quantity and amount of traffic violations, fines, enforcement costs and value of forfeited property.
- C. Modifies the sixth WHEREAS clause by changing the reference and quoted language from HRS § 712A-16(1) to HRS § 291C-171.
- D. Makes miscellaneous technical and non-substantive amendments
