I support adding the protected classes of "sex, sexual orientation, [and] gender identity" to the bill.

When I worked at the State level on improving the status of the LGBT++ community for over a decade, we began our work by adding these categories as protected classes as precursors on our ultimate quest for marriage equality.

One of the bills modified was public accommodations. When marriage equality was legalized here in special session, the next move by the opposition was to attempt to legalize discrimination against gay weddings claiming religious persecution (as we also saw in the US Supreme Court Case, Masterpiece Cakeshop). Because we amended Hawaii's public accommodation law to add these categories as protected classes, the Commission on Civil Rights was able to argue the proposed legalization of discrimination based on sexual orientation.

Even though Hawaii seems a "safe place" for the LGBT community, we must always remember that "the enemy never sleeps". Now that limited national rights have been passed by the federal government, expect to see efforts at the state level to roll back the rights for these and other marginalized communities.

I am writing in strong support of BILL025(21), PROPOSED CD1 - TDST1, which clarifies that sexual orientation and gender expression are among those characteristics protected by Honolulu's anti-bias policy.

Sexual and gender minorities are unfortunately still subject to disproportionate treatment by city government officials in a variety of contexts, from business regulation enforcement to criminal legal system involvement.

The continued criminalization of behavioral health problems falls especially hard on sexual and gender minorities who are from Native Hawaiian and economically under-resourced communities.

It also appears that Honolulu has quite a bit of work to do in terms of hiring, retaining, and promoting sexual and gender minorities in its workforce, including the ranks of its first responders and law enforcement.

At minimum, data should be regularly collected and publicly reported on these fronts to ensure that our local government strives to operate as equitably as possible in the near-term future.

HHHRC's mission is to reduce harm, promote health, create wellness, and fight stigma in Hawai'i and the Pacific. We work with many individuals who are adversely impacted by poverty, housing instability, discrimination, healthcare inequity and other social determinants of health. HHHRC's roots are in the LGBTQ+ community with a transgender health program, an LGBTQ+-specific smoking cessation program and more than 500 participants of other programs who identify as LGBTQ+.

The Hawaii State Department Health was the first health department in the country to publish both a sexual and gender minority health report (2017) and a follow-up report which focused on transgender youth (2018). These reports and the resulting Sexual and Gender Minority Work Group have highlighted the need for a statewide comprehensive strategy for our LGBTQ+ community to address discrimination and bias that results in health disparities and other social inequities in Hawaii.

HHHRC agrees with amending the definition of "Anti-bias" to include sexual orientation and gender identity. We are well-aware of the discrimination and bias facing individuals of sexual orientation and gender identity minorities that happens in all settings. We also recommend extending this policy to City and County contractors as included in the original Bill 025(21) so that it will have greater impact.
