

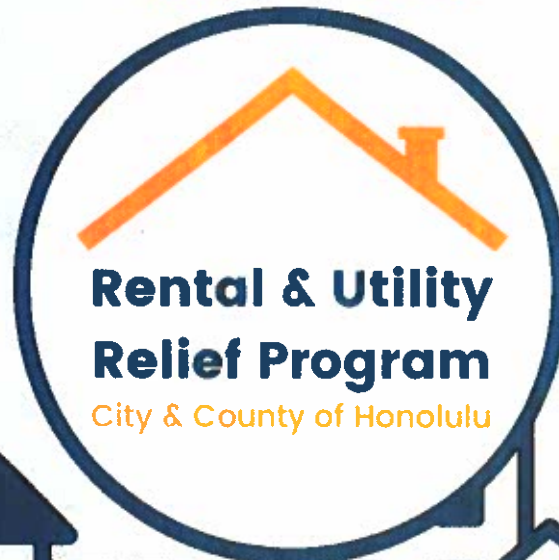

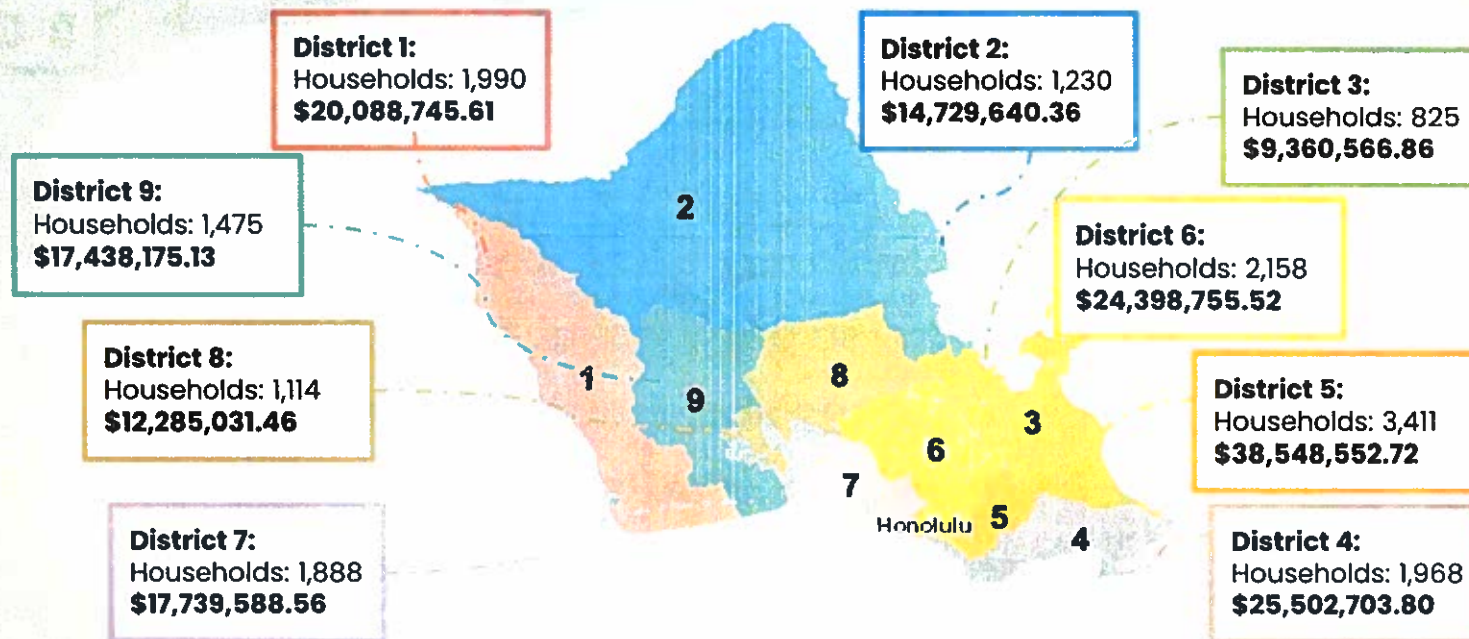

About the **Rental and Utility Relief Program**

- More than 15,000 families remain safely housed
- Among U.S. Treasury's best-performing rent and utility relief programs
- \$207 million distributed on O'ahu
- \$31 million added from State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds

RURP Household Demographics

Program data up to **September 2022**:

- **60%** have a woman as the head of household
- **87%** of families earn at or below half of Honolulu's area median income, which is less than \$63,000 a year for a family of four
- **37%** of recipients identified as Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, **36%** as Asian, **17%** as White, **4.7%** as African American

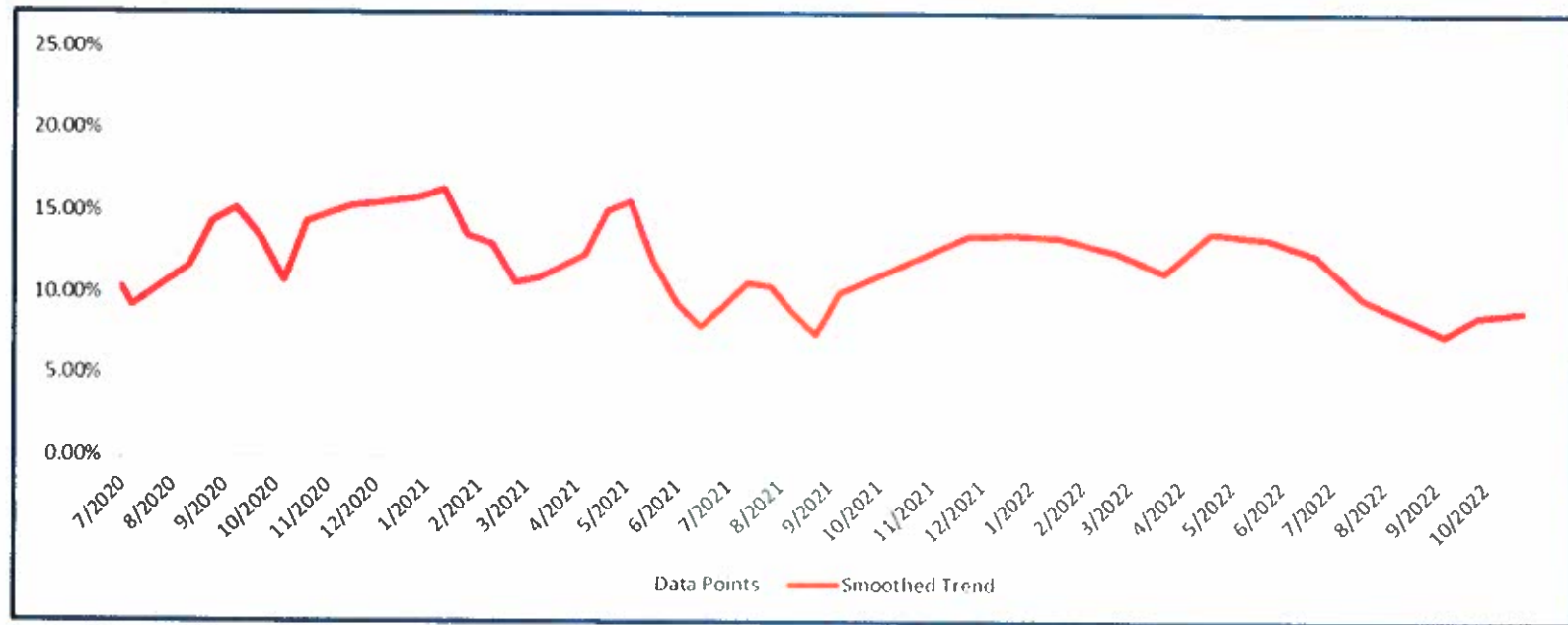


Current Status:

- Secured \$7 million for a temporary reopening in early February
- **Requesting \$33 million** to fund a temporary reopening at the end of the first quarter
- Both reopenings will allow an **estimated 5,800 local families** to apply for their first rent and utility relief assistance



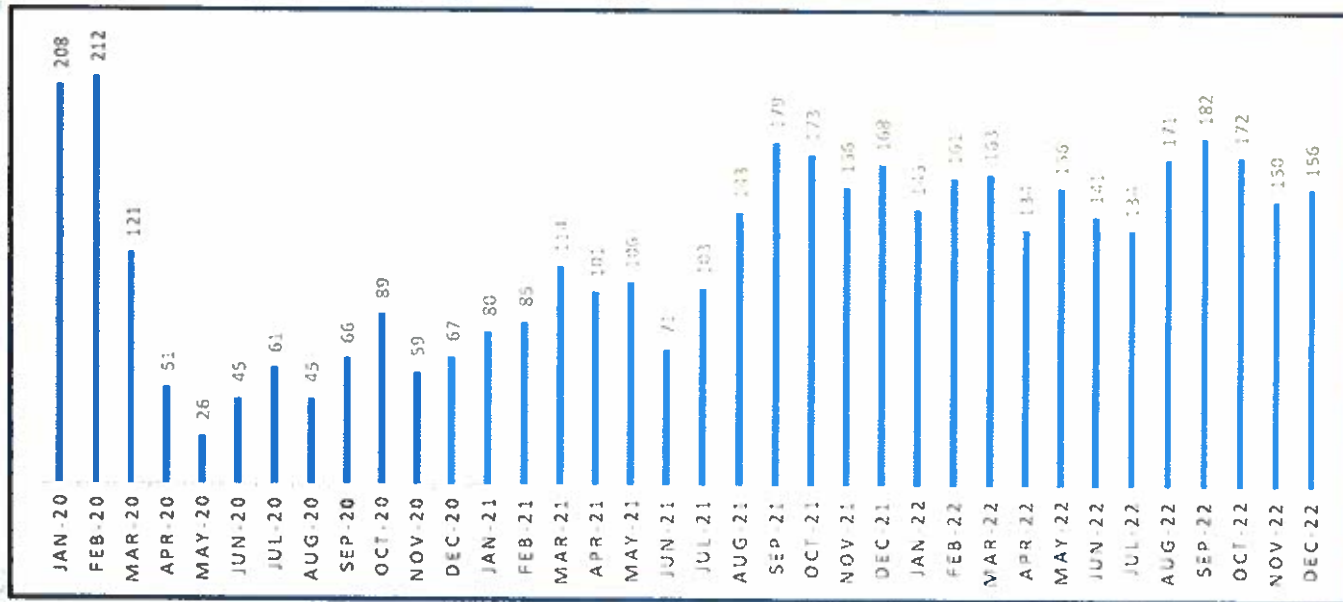
Percent of Hawai'i Households Behind in Their Rent



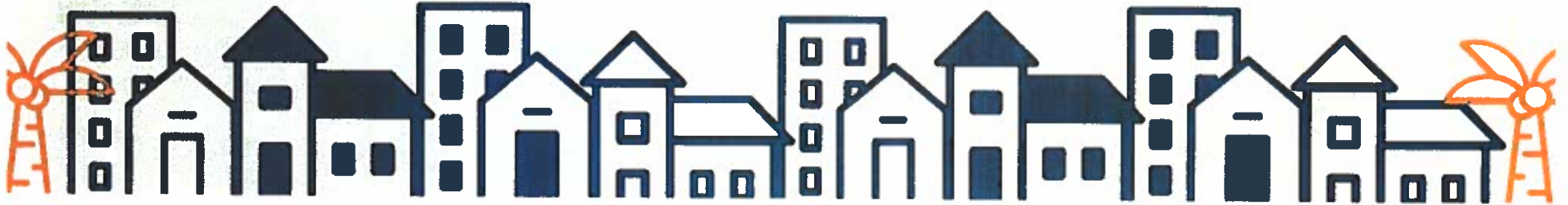
