SUBJECT: City Council Resolution No. 22-291: Authorizing Exemptions from Certain

Requirements Relating to the Keawalau Affordable Housing Community

Project in Waipahu.

The Board of Water Supply (BWS) understands the intent of City Council Resolution No. 22-291, authorizing exemptions from certain requirements relating to the Keawalau Affordable Housing Community Project in Waipahu (herein "Project").

The BWS Board of Directors (Board) passed Resolution No. 889, 2018, Adopting Revisions to the Schedule of Rates and Charges for the Furnishing of Water and Water Service for Fiscal Years 2019 – 2023, effective September 10, 2018 through June 30, 2023. The Board recognizes the importance of affordable water to meet essential household needs and allowed for waiver(s) of the water system facilities charge and new meter cost for qualified affordable and homeless dwelling units, up to 500 dwelling units per year and shall expire on June 30, 2023. The dwelling units must meet certain requirements as specified in the BWS Resolution. Any extension to this Resolution is subject to Board approval.

The BWS is a semi-autonomous agency that does not receive funds from property taxes, so the cost of any waiver will have to be recovered through water rates. As such, the BWS does not allow for exemptions. Under Section 1-102 and 2-202 of the BWS Rules and Regulations, the BWS may allow a deferral of payment of water system facility charges and installation of water service fees until the installation of the water meter, provided that all BWS requirements are satisfied.

For the purpose of consistency, the BWS suggests an amendment to page 3, item #11, as underscored below:

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BWS Rules and Regulations:

11. Deferral from Sections 1-102 and 2-202 of the BWS Rules and Regulations to allow a deferral of payment of water system facility and installation of water service fees estimated at \$1,176,106 until the installation of the water meter; provided that all Board of Water Supply requirements are satisfied. The actual fees to be exempted deferred will be determined by the BWS during review of the building permit applications.

Thank you for your consideration and the opportunity to provide testimony on this matter.
