Aloha Chair, Vice Chair & Members of the Committee,

My name is Zhizi Xiong and on behalf of CARES, I testify in strong support of the bill.

"Anti-bias" education is a term originating from the education sector utilized by teachers, educators & school staff to address bias & prejudice in learning environments. Anti-bias education is designed to increase a mutual understanding of differences and how to be respectful and value everyone, despite our diverse cultural backgrounds, experiences & perspectives.
