<p>Testimony:</p> <p>I stand in support of this measure. I've been a lifelong resident of Makaha and know that Waianae has earned its negative reputation. District 8 is far too big and I would argue holds roughly half the population of the island. District 8 is second only to District 1 in the number of crimes reported to HPD. There is also the issue of our isolation, if Farrington Highway gets blocked anywhere between Nanakuli Ave and Kalaeloa Boulevard we are effectively cut off from the rest of the island, as are the police. There's roughly 18 police officers assigned to District 8 at all times, and they usually respond in large numbers to any incident. I've seen as many as 6 Units show up just to a domestic disturbance call, that's a third of the assigned officers just for one call, you combine that with the distance they have to travel and response time shoots up through the roof. If all the officers respond to a threat in Kapolei and an accident happens that blocks the road going in, they're stuck outside of Waianae until it's cleared</p>
