5. <u>BILL 2 (2023)</u> – RELATING TO FEES FOR USE OF MUNICIPAL GOLF COURSES. Amending Section 10 of the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 2021 relating to fees for a golf identification card. (Transmitted by Communication <u>D-61</u>; Bill passed first reading 2/22/23)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 2 (2023) (Submitted by Councilmember Cordero) – The CD1 (OCS2023-0153/2/24/2023 1:33 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. Amends the purpose clause to remove an incomplete reference to the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 2021 for the purposes of consistency and style.
- B. Separates SECTION 2 into two sections and creates another SECTION of the bill to reflect the amendments made to § 10-4.9 instead of amending both § 10-4.8 and § 10-4.9 in SECTION 2.
- C. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
- 6. <u>BILL 7 (2023)</u> **RELATING TO ADMISSION FEES FOR THE HONOLULU ZOO.** Amending Section 10 of the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 2021 relating to resident admission fees for the Honolulu Zoo. (Transmitted by Communication D-125; Bill passed first reading 3/15/23)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 7 (2023) (Submitted by Councilmember Cordero) – The CD1 (OCS2023-0269/3/28/2023 3:13 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. Amends the title of the bill to remove the reference to "as amended" as it pertains to the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 2021.
- B. Amends the purpose clause to remove an incomplete reference to the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 2021 for the purposes of consistency and style.
- C. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
- 7. <u>BILL 9 (2023)</u> **RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY TAXATION**. Addressing real property tax compromises made by the Director of Budget and Fiscal Services that require City Council approval. (Bill passed first reading 3/15/23)

- 8. <u>BILL 61 (2022)</u> **RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY TAXATION.** Addressing the classification of properties for property taxation purposes, particularly for properties used for residential purposes. (Bill passed first reading 1/25/23)
- 9. <u>BILL 37 (2022)</u> **RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY TAXATION.** Addressing the real property tax credit. (Bill passed second reading and public hearing held 3/15/23)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 37 (2022) (Submitted by Councilmember Weyer) – The CD1 (OCS2023-0286/3/29/2023 9:36 AM) makes the following amendments:

- A. In SECTION 2, increases the threshold of combined income of all titleholders of the property for the calendar year from \$60,000 to \$90,000.
- B. In SECTION 4, provides that the ordinance will apply to tax years beginning July 1, 2024 and thereafter, rather than to tax years beginning July 1, 2023 and thereafter.
- C. Makes miscellaneous technical and non-substantive amendments.
- BILL 38 (2022) RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY TAXATION. Addressing the real property tax credit. (Bill passed second reading and public hearing held 3/15/23)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 38 (2022) (Submitted by Councilmember Kiaʻāina) – The CD1 (OCS2023-0219/3/22/2023 1:24 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. In SECTION 2 of the bill, clarifies that the 80 percent of the area median income for a two-person household criterion for a real property tax credit is determined as of December 31 of the preceding calendar year.
- B. In SECTION 4 of the bill, revises the application of the ordinance from tax years beginning July 1, 2023 and thereafter, to tax years beginning July 1, 2024 and thereafter.
- C. Updates the bill to reflect that the bill is amending the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 2021 instead of the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990.
- D. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 38 (2022) (Submitted by Councilmember Weyer) – The CD1 (OCS2023-0238/3/24/2023 12:03 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. In SECTION 2 of the bill, increases the criterion for a real property tax credit from 80 percent to 100 percent of the area median income for a two-person household in Honolulu as determined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD"), and clarifies that the area median income is determined by HUD as of December 31 of the preceding calendar year.
- B. In SECTION 4 of the bill, revises the application of the ordinance from tax years beginning July 1, 2023 and thereafter, to tax years beginning July 1, 2024 and thereafter.
- C. Updates the bill to reflect that the bill is amending the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 2021 instead of the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990.
- D. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
- 11. <u>BILL 40 (2022)</u> **RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY TAXATION**. Addressing the real property tax home exemption. (Bill passed second reading and public hearing held 3/15/23)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 40 (2022) (Submitted by Councilmember Kiaʻāina) – The CD1 (OCS2023-0201/3/16/2023 2:44 PM) makes the following amendments:

#### A. In SECTION 2 of the bill:

- 1. Increases the home owner's real property tax exemption from \$110,000 to \$120,000 under ROH § 8-10.3(a).
- 2. Increases the home owner's real property tax exemption for persons 65 years of age and older from \$150,000 to \$160,000 under ROH § 8- 10.3(d).
- 3. Provides that the in lieu of home owner exemption for qualifying taxpayers 75 years of age and older reverts to \$160,000 instead of \$140,000 after the maximum period of five years for their claim of exemption expires under ROH § 8-10.3(e).

- B. Updates the bill to reflect that the bill is amending the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 2021 instead of the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990.
- C. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 40 (2022) (Submitted by Councilmember Weyer) – The CD1 (OCS2023-0257/3/28/2023 10:09 AM) makes the following amendments:

- A. In SECTION 2 of the bill:
  - 1. Increases the home owner's real property tax exemption from \$110,000 to \$120,000 under ROH § 8-10.3(a).
  - 2. Increases the home owner's real property tax exemption for persons 65 years of age and older from \$150,000 to \$180,000 under ROH § 8-10.3(d).
  - 3. Limits the low-income senior tax exemption to those 90 years of age or over as of June 30, 2013 and maintains the exemption in the amount of \$200,000.
- B. Updates the bill to reflect that the bill is amending the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 2021 instead of the Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990.
- C. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
- 12. <u>BILL 31 (2022)</u> **RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY TAXATION.** Addressing the real property tax credit for certain homeowners. (Bill passed first reading 5/4/22)
- 13. RESOLUTION 23-40 ESTABLISHING A PERMITTED INTERACTION GROUP. Establishing a Real Property Taxation Permitted Interaction Group, composed of Councilmembers Radiant Cordero, Tommy Waters, Esther Kiaʻāina, and Matthew Weyer, to investigate matters relating to the City's real property taxation.
