1. <u>BILL 28 (2023)</u> – **RELATING TO NALOXONE.** Promoting public health, safety, and welfare by enhancing access to naloxone hydrochloride ("naloxone"). (Bill passed second reading and public hearing held 6/7/23)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 28 (2023) (Submitted by Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam) – The CD1 (OCS2023-0552/6/14/2023 11:29 AM) makes the following amendments:

- A. In SECTION 2 of the bill, amends the following:
  - 1. Fills in the blank in the "Requirement to provide naloxone" section (34-\_\_.2) to require a minimum of two doses of naloxone be available at included businesses.
  - 2. Removes the **"Enforcing agency"** section and renumbers the subsequent sections.
  - 3. Amends the title of section 34-\_\_.6 from "Civil Penalty" to "Penalty."
- B. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.

2. <u>BILL 4 (2023), CD1</u> – RELATING TO THE ADOPTION OF THE STATE ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE. Updating the Building Energy Conservation Code of the City and County of Honolulu through the adoption of the Hawaii State Energy Conservation Code. (Bill passed second reading and public hearing held 6/7/23)

PROPOSED CD2 TO BILL 4 (2023), CD1 (Submitted by Councilmember Weyer) – The CD1 (OCS2023-0558/6/14/2023 12:15 PM makes the following amendments:

A. In paragraph (13), which amends Section C202, amends the definition of ELECTRIC VEHICLE READY SPACE (EV READY SPACE) to read as follows:

ELECTRIC VEHICLE READY SPACE (EV READY SPACE) means a designated parking stall that is provided with a dedicated circuit for future Level 2 EVSE. The circuit shall terminate in a suitable termination point such as a receptacle, <u>pullbox</u>, <u>handhole</u>, or junction box located in close proximity to the proposed location of the EV parking stall. <u>The service panel shall include an over-current protection device</u>.

- B. In paragraph (26), which adds proposed new Section C409, amends the reference in C409.2 from "certified design professional" to "registered design professional" to conform to the defined term in the Hawai'i State Energy Code.
- C. In paragraph (30), which adds proposed new Section R103.2, deletes the requirement that certain, specific details be included in construction documents for all residential construction.
- D. In paragraph (31), which amends Section R202, deletes the proposed new definition of "SOLAR-READY ZONE."
- E. In paragraph (48), which adds proposed new Section R408, deletes proposed new Sections R408.1 through R408.1.10 and replaces those sections with proposed new Section R408.1, which reads as follows:
  - "R408.1 Solar conduit and electrical panel readiness. Construction documents shall indicate a location for inverters, metering equipment, battery equipment, energy storage equipment, and other equipment necessary to interconnect a residence with on-site solar energy generation facilities with the electrical grid in compliance with applicable laws, statutes, and utility tariffs. Construction documents shall indicate a pathway for routing of conduit from the solar panel location to the point of interconnection with electrical service. New single-family detached dwellings, two-family detached dwellings, and duplexes shall install for each residence an electrical panel with reserved space to accommodate not less than a five Kilowatt (AC) photovoltaic system. New multifamily dwellings shall install an electrical panel that includes space reserved to accommodate a photovoltaic system: (1) sized to serve common area electrical loads, or (2) sized to the roof space available. The reserved space shall be clearly labeled as solar PV ready. All feeders and electrical distribution equipment, including switchgear, switchboards, and panel boards that will be fed simultaneously by the electrical grid and other power sources shall be sized to support the installation of future solar energy generation systems per the

interconnection requirements of the Electrical Code. New residential buildings shall also install conduit not less than one and one-half inches to provide a pathway from the electrical panel to the inverter location and from the inverter location to the underside of the roof sufficient to allow future installation of solar equipment. If conduits are to be installed between separate buildings or other structures, construction documents shall provide sufficient details to show that compliance with the Electrical Code's restrictions on the number of power supplies to each building or other structure has been examined."

- F. Deletes SECTION 5 of the bill, which provided that the Revisor of Ordinances shall, pursuant to the Revisor's authority under ROH § 1-16.3(b)(1), replace the phrase "effective date of this ordinance" or similar phrase used in the codified language of this ordinance with the actual date on which the ordinance takes effect, and renumbers SECTION 6 of the bill as SECTION 5.
- G. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
