- 1. RESOLUTION 23-148 APPOINTMENT OF GWENETTE HIGA TO THE BOARD OF REVIEW I FOR REAL PROPERTY TAX APPEALS. Confirming the appointment of Gwenette Higa to the Board of Review I for real property tax appeals of the City and County of Honolulu for a term to expire on June 30, 2028. (Transmitted by Communication MM-127; public hearing held 7/12/23)
- 2. RESOLUTION 23-175 TRANSFER OF FUNDS (DCS). Authorizing a transfer not to exceed \$696,991 from the Provision for Grants Partnerships and Security activity (current expenses) to the Department of Community Services, Community Based Development activity (current expenses) for the fiscal year 2024 to meet the local match grant program needs of the DCS. (Transmitted by Communication D-533)
- 3. RESOLUTION 23-166 REAL PROPERTY TAX COMPROMISE. Approving a one-time compromise of the real property taxes owed by Smith Beretania Bridge LP for the property located at 1170 Nuuanu Avenue for the tax year beginning July 1, 2021 in the amount due of \$18,668.20 plus applicable penalties and interest, and for the tax year beginning July 1, 2022 in the amount due of \$18,753.76 plus applicable penalties and interest, which sums represent the taxes due from the assessed value of the non-exempt commercial units. - 4. RESOLUTION 23-169 WASTEWATER SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS (SENIOR SERIES). Authorizing the Director of Budget and Fiscal Services to issue and sell not to exceed \$225,000,000 principal amount of Wastewater System Revenue Bonds, Senior Series 2023 and related matters. (Transmitted by Communication D-515)

5. <u>BILL 42 (2023)</u> – **RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY TAXATION.** Providing property tax relief to certain homeowners. (Bill passed first reading 7/12/23)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 42 (2023) (Submitted by Councilmember Cordero) – The CD1 (OCS2023-0646/7/17/2023 3:29 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. In new ROH § 8-7.__, clarifies that the assessed value of the real property must not exceed the preceding tax year's assessed value by more than 8 percent.
- B. Makes various technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
- 6. <u>BILL 39 (2023)</u> **RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY TAXATION.** Establishing a real property tax exemption for certain real property located near an active landfill. (Bill passed first reading 7/12/23)

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 39 (2023) (Submitted by Council Chair Waters) – The CD1 (OCS2023-0665/7/19/2023 2:18 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. Amends SECTION 2 of the bill to specify that qualifying properties are entitled to an exemption from real property taxes and are exempt from the minimum real property tax levied under ROH § 8-11.1.
- B. In SECTION 2 of the bill, amends language to clarify that a claim for exemption, once allowed, continues upon the closure or relocation of an active landfill for up to 30 years.
- C. Adds a new SECTION 3 of the bill to specify that properties exempt under new ROH § 8-10.__ are excepted from the minimum real property tax levied under ROH § 8-11.1(g). Renumbers subsequent SECTIONS of the bill.
- D. In renumbered SECTION 5 of the bill, amends the effective date to apply to tax years beginning July 1, 2025 and thereafter, and provides that the claim for exemption continues upon the closure or relocation of an active landfill for a period not to exceed 30 years.
- E. Makes various technical and nonsubstantive amendments.

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7. <u>BILL 34 (2023)</u> – **RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY TAXATION**. Addressing the real property tax home exemption. (Bill passed first reading 7/12/23)
