- 2. RESOLUTION 23-217 MULTIFAMILY HOUSING REVENUE BONDS. Authorizing the issuance and delivery of a multifamily housing revenue note in a principal amount not to exceed \$30,000,000 for the purpose of making a mortgage loan to provide financing to JHW Kuhaulua Partners LP, a Hawaii limited partnership, for a multifamily rental housing development; determining and prescribing certain other matters relating thereto and approving and authorizing related actions and the execution and delivery of related documents and agreements. - 3. <u>BILL 47 (2023)</u> RELATING TO RECYCLING. Addressing curbside recycling, including the collection of manufactured compostable materials. (Bill passed first reading 9/6/23)
- 4. <u>BILL 46 (2023), CD1</u> FLAVORED TOBACCO PRODUCTS. Defining and prohibiting the sale of flavored tobacco products within the City and County of Honolulu. (Bill passed second reading and public hearing held 9/6/23)

PROPOSED CD2 TO BILL 46 (2023), CD1 (Submitted by Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam) – The CD2 (OCS2023-0824/9/7/2023 1:13 PM) makes the following amendments:

A. In SECTION 1 of the bill, removes references to cigars and little cigars.

- B. In SECTION 2 of the bill, ROH § 41-__.1 ("Definitions"):
 - 1. Adds definitions for "Hookah," "Loose Leaf Tobacco," "Premium Cigar," and "Shisha Tobacco Product."
 - 2. In the definition of "Tobacco Product," removes references to "pipe tobacco," "hookahs," and "pipes."
- C. In SECTION 2 of the bill, ROH § 41- .2 ("Prohibition"):
 - 1. Moves the last paragraph in subsection (b), "Presumption of flavor," which concerns the disposal of unlawful items, to a new subsection (c).
 - 2. Adds a new subsection (d), "Exceptions," that exempts premium cigars, loose leaf tobacco, and shisha tobacco products from the prohibition.
- D. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
