Councilmember Tupola voiced her support of the Salcedos who testified today and who are huge community advocates in Waianae. She stated her support for the Bill and noted that the Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy (C-PACE) program is only one solution to financing. Councilmember Tupola suggested that a Memorandum of Understanding be executed so that there is clarity of what the City is in charge of versus what Hawaii Green Infrastructure Authority is in charge of.

Councilmember Say stated his support of the measure. He suggested that when the measure goes back to Committee, there should be a discussion on whether there will be a special assessment property tax increase on top of the present assessment. Councilmember Say stated that another issue that needs to be addressed is the financing of the fund. He stated that the Legislature passes the mandate to the City and stated for the record that it is not fair for the City to pick up the tab for every cesspool project on O'ahu.

BILL 6, CD2, FD1 – COMMITTEE REPORT 291

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL SELF-CERTIFICATION.

Councilmember Say moved that Committee Report 291 be adopted and Bill 6, CD1 pass third reading as amended to CD2. Seconded by Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam.

Councilmember Kia'aina gave a brief background on Bill 7 as presented at the Zoning Committee (D-606). She stated that she cannot vote for a policy involving public health and safety when other developers have raised parity issues over affordable housing projects that get special treatment. Councilmember Kia'aina stated that she would like to focus on the building permit process and improve the existing third-party review process. She stated that her amendment version ending in 997 would remove Chapter 32 rental housing projects from the list of eligible projects that can use self-certification and the amendment version ending in 998 would mitigate some of her concerns by allowing self-certification for Chapter 32 projects if the certified professional has previously obtained at least two building permits and one certificate of occupancy for other Chapter 32 projects.

Councilmember Say stated that he understood the concerns of Councilmember Kia'aina. He stated that if self-certification is incorporated into Bill 7, the Administration will have third-party review, special assignment investigations, and self-certification. He stated that the Bill includes a provision that the building official will be promulgating rules. Councilmember Say suggested giving the Bill a chance since a \$10 million grant program and the extension of Bill 7 was adopted.

Councilmember Weyer noted that both amendments are reasonable and would support either of them.

Councilmember Cordero stated that she would like to see the amendment version ending in 998 move forward.

Councilmember Tupola stated that she believes that the Department of Planning and Permitting (DPP) would prefer self-certification over what is currently written in the law because the current law states that in 90 days if the Building Code reviewer does not approve the permit, then it is automatically approved but DPP does not follow that. She stated that self-certification would be better because the permit would still have to go back

to the DPP to get the final permit approved. Councilmember Tupola stated that she supports the current draft and believes that whatever happens it will be resolved in the Administrative Rules.

Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam stated that the City needs to be careful not to allow abuse of the self-certification program. He believes there is room for self-certification to be utilized for Chapter 32 projects but does not want to see it abused. He stated that the amendment version ending in 998 is very reasonable for the people who have a track record of following the rules, who have gotten permits in, who have gotten to a certificate of occupancy and have proven themselves. Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam stated that he would support the amendment version ending in 998.

Councilmember Kia'āina thanked all councilmembers for the discussion. She explained that her community in Kailua has a Bill 7 project and expressed concern that they do not have an avenue to voice their concerns and she explained to them that the DPP has the sole administrative authority to make decisions.

Councilmember Kia'āina moved that the Bill be amended to the handcarried FD1 (OCS2023-0997/10/30/2023 11:14 AM). Seconded by Councilmember Weyer. Councilmember Kia'āina explained the FD1 amendment.

Councilmember Cordero stated that she prefers the amendment version ending in 998.

Councilmember Weyer stated that the amendment version ending in 998 provides a balance but he would prefer supporting the amendment version ending in 997 because of the information that he has and the safety concerns.

Councilmember Okimoto stated that she is leaning towards the amendment version ending in 998 but would like Councilmember Kia'āina to clarify the difference between the two amendments.

Councilmember Kia'āina stated that she proposed both amendments for discussion. She noted that the amendment version ending in 997 would remove the Bill 7 projects which represents what her community would like. She noted that if that amendment failed she should offer the amendment version ending in 998.

Councilmember Tupola stated that she prefers the amendment version ending in 998. She stated that Bill 7 should be amended to address the concerns of the community not having input. Councilmember Tupola stated that there are still underlying concerns that both amendments may not resolve. She noted that she spoke with DPP and they are willing to incorporate changes into the Administrative Rules as well.

Bill 6, CD2 failed to be amended to the handcarried FD1 (OCS2023-0997/10/30/2023 11:14 AM) due to lack of a majority vote.

Councilmember Kia'āina moved that the Bill be amended to the handcarried FD1 (OCS2023-0998/10/30/2023 3:23 PM). Seconded by Councilmember Weyer. Councilmember Kia'āina explained the FD1 amendment.

Councilmember Say voiced his opposition to the measure. He stated that it is difficult when the permit is not approved and then apply for self-certification. Councilmember Say read portions of the amendment. He stated that the goals and objectives for the Zoning Chair was to address the 22,000 projects with another tool for the DPP. He noted that there is no enforcement but has encouraged his community to call if they see a problem so that an inspector can go out and investigate. He stated that the measure gives the DPP another tool to promote the development of affordable housing for the people of O'ahu.

In response to councilmembers, Dawn Takeuchi Apuna, Director, Department of Planning and Permitting (DPP) stated that:

- From the Department's perspective, the self-certification program should allow the most qualified person based on their track record with the Department. Regardless of the types of projects, the DPP would want people to have a proven track record, that they will do their job properly, and can be trusted that they will certify based on their experience and their expertise.
- The self-certification allows those who are not approved by the 90-day requirement to move forward.
- A robust program that weeds out the best would allow the DPP to rely on them to do the right thing. The DPP will have more stringent requirements to ensure that they are doing their job properly through the program.
- The DPP will decide what licensed architects or engineers can self-certify and they would need a minimum of one certificate of occupancy granted and two building permits granted. The Department may increase the requirements.
