On January 24, you testified before the Honolulu City Council regarding Bill 59 (2023), "Relating to Incentives for Film Studio Facilities." During Council discussion, I asked several questions regarding the fiscal impact of the measure.

I acknowledge that, due to the technical nature of these questions, a precise answer could not be provided immediately. Accordingly, I would like to formally request via this Council Communication answers to the below questions:

1. How many film studios will Bill 59 (2023) be applicable to?
2. Hypothetically, if a 10-acre parcel in West O'ahu utilized Bill 59 (2023) to build a $\$ 100,000,000$ film studio beginning in Fiscal Year (FY) 2025:
a. What would the projected fiscal impact be for a five-year "qualifying construction - film studio facilities" exemption?
b. What would the projected fiscal impact be for the 20-year "film studio facilities" exemption, presumably beginning in FY 2030?
3. It's clear that a new film studio would broadly provide economic benefits to the island in the form of additional general excise taxes, income taxes, etc. Can the Department provide a reasonable ballpark estimate for any additional direct revenues for the City which may result from the construction of a new film studio?
