Councilmember Kia'āina stated that she is in support of the measure but expressed her concern that the more Charter questions on the ballot, the more voters will get confused. She also stated that she is hesitant to amend the Charter for something that is already being addressed. Councilmember Kia'āina stated that the issue of homelessness is tough as it is and the Council should be supporting the appropriate funding and policies for the non-profit partners as well as State and City programs.

Councilmember Tupola stated that the Solutions Advisory Council needs to advise the Department of Community Services, Housing, or the Homeless Working Group which could be done without changing the Charter. She also noted that in the measure it stated that the Advisory Council would be made up of 9 members and suggested that each councilmember have a representative from their district that can speak to the types of problems in their area.

Councilmember Okimoto stated that she and Councilmember Weyer introduced the measure to address the severe homelessness issue and to allow the voices of the people to be heard. She hopes that the measure can continue to move and have more discussion in Committee.

Councilmember Weyer echoed the sentiments of Councilmember Okimoto. He stated that he is open to amendments on the appointment process. Councilmember Weyer has concerns on the structural issues that are being faced and recognize that there is not a policy lead in the Managing Director's Office and this measure will provide the space for experts in this particular field to shape and direct the City policy.

Councilmember Kia'āina stated her support of the measure. She noted that she will be reviewing all the measures and then she will introduce an amendment to one of the measures and hopefully there can be one measure that can go to the full Council for final reading.

Chair Waters stated that the intent is to schedule an Executive Matters Committee meeting and hear all the measures. He encouraged councilmembers to introduce their amendments as soon as possible.

Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam stated that he appreciates the intent of the measure but noted that there are other issues like the housing crisis, illegal vacation rentals, monster homes, or game room issues that the Council needs to be accountable to move forward on these issues.

Councilmember Tupola stated that she appreciates the intent and conversation about safety on Halloween but that the communities should be making the decision with the neighborhoods about safety on Halloween and when to celebrate.

Councilmember Cordero stated that she did not get a lot of comments from her constituents and noted that Halloween gets celebrated at churches or in the community. She agreed with the testifier that this is not the form to discuss this issue.

Councilmember Kia'āina stated her opposition to the measure. She noted that she understands the concerns but she does not believe that this is the appropriate forum. Councilmember Kia'āina noted that she did not hear any concerns from her district and suggested that this issue may be more appropriate for discussion at the neighborhood board.

Councilmember Okimoto stated that as a matter of principle she does not believe that the Council should be over-legislating this issue. She noted that she did not hear anything from her community. Councilmember Okimoto stated that she will be voting no on the Bill.

Councilmember Weyer stated his appreciation for the conversation on the measure and is in support. He noted that the measure is just encouraging people to celebrate on Saturday.

Chair Waters stated that he introduced the measure as Mr. McPherson asked him to look into the situation. He noted that in researching, there are two times more pedestrian fatalities nationwide on October 31 and an 11 percent increase in fatality rates when Halloween takes place on a weekday compared to the weekend.

Bill 29 failed to pass first reading due to a lack of a majority vote.

Councilmember Say explained the process of the Charter amendment.

In response to Councilmember Say, Glen Takahashi, City Clerk stated that the Charter amendment needs to pass three readings by the July Council meeting at the latest.

Councilmember Tupola noted that the discussion at the Executive Management Committee was important and that there are a lot of ideas and the Council needs to take the most important ones. She stated that Councilmember Tulba's proposal with representation from each Council district provides fresh perspective with each incoming Commission member which would remove any bias or impartiality to the outcome of any recommendation. She noted the second most important point is that elected officials should be limited to a 3.5 percent salary increase or tied to collective bargaining and remove any ability for elected officials to weigh in on the suggested raises.

Councilmember Tupola stated that the Salary Commission needs to have more leeway on non-elected positions to be sure that the positions can be filled. She agreed that non-elected officials should not have a salary increase ceiling.

Councilmember Okimoto stated that it will be helpful to incorporate everything that was shared into one measure. She noted that what Maui does is whatever the Commission decides then the Council just accepts it.
