Councilmember Kia'āina thanked Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam for his leadership on the measure and also to the Honolulu Police Department and the Department of Transportation Services. She stated that many Neighborhood Boards, the Hawai'i Bicycling League, parents, and kupuna are concerned about speeding especially near schools. Councilmember Kia'āina stated that the measure decreases the speed limit by five miles which will help decrease pedestrian fatalities by more than 50 percent. She thanked the Department of Transportation Services, Complete Streets team for looking at a comprehensive approach to the issue.

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Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam stated that it is time to revisit the issue to make sure the concepts are followed. He also stated that the events should be in the interest of the public and not to enrich the organizers of the event because public streets are for the public to enjoy. Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam noted that he looks forward to working with Chair Waters and his staff on an amendment to the measure.

Councilmember Say stated that maybe there should be a limit to parades in Waikiki and have street festivals done only at Kapiolani or Ala Moana Park because the events have become a nuisance to the businesses that pay their rent and taxes and are losing business because of these events.

In response to Councilmember Say, Deputy Director Jon Nouchi, Department of Transportation Services stated that currently there are 15 legacy activities which are events with a consecutive span, never missing a year. He stated that if the Hawai'i Tourism Authority supports an event, they would still need to go through the street usage permitting process to get a permit for their event whether it be a street festival, parade or a road race.

Councilmember Weyer stated that he appreciates the conversation on the measure and acknowledges that there will be amendments and will be supportive of the amendments.

Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam thanked Councilmember Tulba who is the co-sponsor of the Bill and everyone who participated at the last Transportation Committee meeting. He stated that Department of Transportation Services and the Honolulu Police Department (HPD) has a working group that has been meeting and has been very productive. Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam stated that his intended time line on the measure is to have an informational briefing on October 22 from the working group to discuss what they have been working on and their recommendation; and then on November 19 he would like to take the recommendation from the working group, councilmembers, and the public and incorporate that into a final draft to be considered and passed out by the end of the year. He thanked Councilmember Okimoto for her introduction of Resolution 24-199 that passed and called upon the Legislature to work on the issue. Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam stated that the City needs to work in conjunction with the Legislature to set some boundaries and expectations on the Bill which will help HPD with enforcement and help parents to have conversations with their children to teach them what the law is.

Councilmember Okimoto thanked the Administration for initiating the working group because it is important to discuss the matter further. She noted that hearing the testimonies shows that the situation impacts all communities in all districts. Councilmember Okimoto stated that the City needs the Legislature to consider what they can do to help the situation and make sure keiki are safe, roads are safe, and to help educate the parents.

Councilmember Tupola thanked Corporation Counsel for giving the Council their insight on other issues that should be considered before passage of the Bill. She stated her concern about the constitutionality of the Bill and that she does not want to be a part of a bill in which the tax burden does not provide a benefit to the constituents. Councilmember Tupola stated that she will be voting no on the measure based on what has been said but she is looking forward to more conversations in Committee.

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Councilmember Tulba thanked the testifiers and stated that he will be voting no on the measure. He noted that the Department of Budget and Fiscal Services is working towards a study of an empty home tax program and he would like to see what the study says before rushing into legislation that might do more harm to local homeowners. Councilmember Tulba expressed his concern that if the Bill passes, many homeowners will not realize that their tax liability is going to increase over 250 percent depending on the value of their home if they do not qualify for an exemption. He stated that he hopes that when the Bill goes back to Committee, they can look at the impact it will have on local people so that local people can live and stay in Hawai'i.

Councilmember Kia'aina stated that she continues to have concerns regarding the proposed budget allocations in the current CD1 and she will continue to advocate for a draft that removes the allocations from the measure. She noted that one of the major challenges in the City is the personnel capacity at the Departments of Land Management and Community Services to be able to move projects forward. Councilmember Kia'aina expressed her desire to pass a measure that strikes the right balance of generating needed funds, incentivizing property owners to offer their housing units into the Honolulu market, as well as ensuring local families that they will not be negatively impacted by the tax. She stated that she will be voting with reservations on the measure and when the Bill goes back to Committee, if her concerns are not addressed, she will be voting no at that time.

Councilmember Okimoto stated that the Council should be looking at incentivizing versus penalizing and that her concern is that the measure will penalize local families. She noted that the best thing the Council can do is to support the Administration, the Department of Land Management, and the Office of Housing so that they can develop affordable housing projects. Councilmember Okimoto stated that she will be voting in opposition to the measure as it is.

Councilmember Say expressed his support of the measure and stated that the Council should allow the Bill to move forward to the Budget Committee. He noted that when the measure goes to Committee and the fiscal impacts are greater to the local residents then he may vote no but if it will benefit the local residents he is in support.

Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam stated that he will be voting in support of the measure. He noted that in the measure there is an Affordable Housing Fund and he would like to have a greater discussion about how the fund is being used because he believes the fund is not being used to its fullest extent. Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam stated that he has been very vocal about the proliferation of illegal vacation rentals in the community and he does not want to see a policy that allows illegal vacation operations to create contracts. He stated that everything comes down to enforcement and that there will be

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people who try to get around the law. He pointed out that the Council is a policy making body that sets expectations. He stated that he looks forward to continued discussion in Committee.

Councilmember Weyer stated that he appreciates all the work and thought that has gone into the Bill and supports moving the Bill forward. He noted that the version that was passed out of the Housing Committee was intended to minimize the impact on residents with situations outside of their control. Councilmember Weyer stated that by the discussion on the measure, councilmembers are contemplating ways to better meet the needs of local families through amendments and he looks forward to those in Committee.

Councilmember Cordero thanked everyone for their discussion of the Bill, including community members who have submitted testimonies and communicated with their councilmember. She stated that she would like to have a discussion on the measure at a Special Committee on Budget meeting. Councilmember Cordero noted that the components that she would like to discuss would be the supplemental tax which Council Chair Waters mentioned, exemptions including penalties, allocations, and administration costs, as well as reporting.

Chair Waters stated that the measure is to try to keep local lands in local hands by doing two things, either incentivizing local residents to rent it out to other local families or incentivizing them to sell to a local family. He asked councilmembers to give the Budget Chair a chance to work on the measure and alleviate the concerns that were mentioned.

Councilmember Tulba stated his support for the measure but understands the Fire Department's concern. He stated that there has been a ban on fireworks for the past 14 years and it is not working. He believes that there needs to be some balance so that our children can enjoy sparklers and fountains. Councilmember Tulba stated that the Bill will allow families to have a safe way to purchase fireworks and it will be the responsibility of each family to ensure that fireworks will be handled in a safe manner.

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Councilmember Okimoto thanked Councilmember Say for his approach of having common sense and balance when introducing the measure. She stated that she respects the HFD stance on the measure. Councilmember Okimoto noted she respects the different cultures and if allowing fireworks brings back balance to communities in a safe manner, she supports the measure.

Councilmember Kia'āina commended Councilmember Say for trying to strike the right balance on the Bill. She noted that one of the concerns that keeps happening in the community are fires being triggered by arsonists and she urged communities to be vigilant.
