DDC:The project adjustment account in the past has prevented the rebidding of projects. Rebidding causes delays to a much needed improvement and adds cost and manpower to repackage the project. With the recent federal tariffs on material costs it is difficult to estimate its impacts on our construction costs; it is beneficial that project adjustment funds are available to cover cost impacts which are unknown at this time. DPR: DPR expresses concerns regarding proposed amendment as it will limit DDC's ability to bid and award a contract should the final bid come in higher than anticipated.
