He stated that the Council received a communication on the loss of Federal funding and it was important to show the community that the situation is being taken seriously. Councilmember Weyer noted that the focus should be on presenting stability and support to the community.

In response to Councilmembers, Roger Babcock, Director, Department of Environmental Services (ENV) noted:

- ENV proposed additional and new potential rate schedules for consideration and discussion at the next Budget meeting scheduled on April 29, 2025.
- ENV proposed a 10-year rate package beginning on July 1st for Fiscal Year 2026 out through 2035 with flexibility to adjust when the rate increase will start and the percentage of increases each year to meet revenue requirements that include operation and maintenance, debt service and capital funding.
- The rate increase needs to be approved for Fiscal Year 2026.
- The rate package proposes an even rate increase over the years instead of following project requirements where rate increases are inconsistent and vary annually.
- Currently, ENV has over 300 vacant positions which accounts for a large portion of the funds that lapsed from 2019 to 2024.
- Operations and maintenance costs are estimated conservatively and budgeted annually to ensure that funds remain at the end of the fiscal year. The funds remain in the Sewer Fund and is available for future use.
- Revisions were made to the rate projections and ENV's operation and maintenance program budgets were reduced by 10 percent to eliminate any potential lapse in funding for the next 10 years.
- The rate package includes a 115 percent overall increase. Rates include a base charge and a volumetric charge. Customers who use less water will see as little as a 70 percent increase while customers who use more water will see much higher increases.
- When capital project funds lapse, it means the funds were appropriated but not encumbered. The money was not able to be spent because the project did not move forward due to contract delays, protests or other reasons.

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- ENV would need to check with the Bond Council and do more evaluation on the feasibility of implementing a rebate program.

Council Chair Waters stated that the CD1 amendment for the Bill lowers the fee increase from the original 10 percent to 4 percent for the next ten years. He urged the Administration and members of the Council to find existing funds to offset the high rates that will be implemented. Council Chair Waters noted that upon final passage of the Bill, the Board of Water Supply would need sufficient time to retool their billing.
