Councilmember Kia'āina emphasized the need for clear guidelines, stating that fee structures, including parking fees, should be subject to Council approval. She noted that Ho'omaluhia Botanical Gardens, in her district, is highly visited by local residents and visitors and expressed support for implementing a fee and establishing a fund, provided there is appropriate Council oversight and defined parameters.

Councilmember Cordero expressed support for the Bill and noted prior discussions about charging for parking at certain parks and recreational areas. She stated that she looks forward to further discussion as the measure advances.

Councilmember Dos Santos-Tam echoed the comments of Councilmember Kia'āina regarding Botanical Gardens, noting that Foster Botanical Garden is located in his district. He stated that the Garden serves both residents and visitors and emphasized the importance of ensuring that any proposed fees are fair and reasonable.

She highlighted the importance of ensuring that funding is equitably distributed to support all agencies involved and stated that she looks forward to continued discussion as the measure advances.
