Councilmember Manahan explained that the Bill was moved out of Committee to catch up with the other revenue enhancement measures being considered with the budget. He noted that the Bill currently does not include amounts for disposal of bulky items or trash collection fees but contains an effective date to continue discussion in Committee. Councilmember Manahan stated that there will be an amendment to the Bill that may offset some of the trash fees with property taxes. He asked councilmembers to move the measure forward and to consider the Bill further in Committee.

Councilmember Fukunaga expressed her appreciation to Director Kahikina and her staff for attending neighborhood board meetings and explaining the bulky item pilot project to affected neighborhoods. She stated that it would be premature to impose a fee for bulky item pick up before the pilot program is completed. Councilmember Fukunaga stated she will vote with reservations because the Bill does have an effective date and while she appreciates the continued discussion, she does not support a trash collection fee or a fee for bulky item pick up.

Councilmember Tsuneyoshi echoed Councilmember Fukunaga's concerns. She noted that there was a lengthy discussion in Committee and based on the discussions, she will continue to be in opposition to the residential refuse fee pick up. Councilmember Tsuneyoshi looks forward to more discussion on the bulky item pick up fee after the pilot project is completed.

Councilmember Waters also echoed Councilmember Fukunaga's concerns. He stated he does not support any fee for garbage pick up and will vote with reservations.

Chair Anderson stated he will vote with reservations to move the measure back to Committee for further discussion. He noted his opposition to residential refuse pick up fees.

Councilmember Pine stated her support because the trash fee is temporarily removed at this point. She noted that she is open to support an arrangement for bulky item pick up. Councilmember Pine stated that the City does not pick up the bulky items when they are supposed to and the items are left out for a whole month in some districts. She supports the Budget Chair and his efforts to address the situation.

Chair Anderson stated he supports the consideration of a fee for scheduled bulky item pick up.

Councilmember Elefante noted for the record that he filed a Disclosure of Interest with the City Clerk's Office (CC-143).

Councilmember Pine moved that the Bill be amended to the handcarried FD1. Seconded by Councilmember Elefante. The FD1 makes the following amendments:

- A. In Section -1.1 ("Definitions"), revises the definition of affordable rental housing project" by revising criterion (1) to provide that at least 80 percent of the total units must be rented to households earning 100 percent and below of the AMI, and rented at or below the rental rate limits established by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for households earning 100 percent of the AMI for the applicable household size or less. Makes conforming amendments to the definitions of "affordable rental housing unit" and "declaration of restrictive covenants."
- B. Deletes Section \_-2.10 relating to nonconforming uses. Renumbers the subsequent section accordingly.
- C. Amends Section 14-1 0.\_(a)(4) in SECTION 3 (waiver of wastewater facility charges); Section 18-6.50) in SECTION 4 (waiver of plan review and building permit fees); Section 22-7.3(j)(4) in SECTION 5 (waiver of park dedication requirements); and Section 8-10.Y(b)(4) and Section 8-10.Y(c) in SECTION 7 (real property tax holiday during construction and marketing phase) to add requirements that the rent amount must be at or below the rental rate limits established by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for households earning 100 percent of the AMI for the applicable household size or less.

- D. In SECTION 6 (real property tax exemption), amends Section 8-1 0.X(g)(2) to add a requirement that the rent amount must be at or below the rental rate limits established by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for households earning 80 percent of the AMI for the applicable household size or less.
- E. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.

Councilmember Elefante thanked Zoning and Housing Chair Pine for introducing the proposed floor draft. He noted that he did offer an amendment but would support Councilmember Pine's amendment. Councilmember Elefante stated that the intent of the Bill is to build more affordable housing units and to guarantee affordable rates.

Councilmember Pine asked councilmembers to support the amendment. She explained that after two years of trying to establish affordable housing, she realized that the government cannot do it alone, so the measure targets small land owners, especially apartment zone owners. She thanked community groups and especially Christine Otta Zaa, Marshall Hun, Mel Kaneshige, Derek Lock, the Mayor and the leaders of the Department of Planning and Permitting who helped support the measure and bring everyone together. Councilmember Pine urged councilmembers to support the measure.

- The playground is a conceptual design right now so there is no gift resolution because there is no cost estimate.
- Given her years of experience of planning, designing, building, and overseeing the construction of recreational areas, the playground is a safe environment.
- The restroom is included in the planning and design stage.
- She would appreciate going through the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) process first.
- If the sand is not replenished, part of the beach may be lost.

In response to councilmembers, Robert Kroning, Director, Department of Design and Construction stated that:

• All of the projects must go through additional public processes.

- The master plan EIS is to determine the environmental, economical, and cultural impacts of the proposed plans.
- Once the EIS is complete it will go to the Mayor to approve or disapprove the project.
- There are permitting processes that also need to be approved.
- The EIS covers where the City will mine the sand from.
- Sea Engineering has done an analysis on the impacts at several different locations for sand mining and included potential effects on the waves in the proposed areas.
- It would be good to keep all the projects in the EIS and once it has been determined that there will be no negative impacts to make a decision whether or not to move forward with the projects.

Councilmember Waters stated his support for the community and that he would vote in support of the original version and in opposition to the two amendments. He noted that as a new councilmember he wants to be the bridge between the Administration and the community.

Councilmember Elefante stated that he did offer a proposed draft but his intent was to support Councilmember Kobayashi's amendment. He noted his concern with the sand replenishment and the playground. Councilmember Elefante also noted that we need to look at what is envisioned in the future.
