26. **Bill 32 (2019)** – and any amendments proposed thereto by the **Committee on Transportation** – Relating to restricted parking zones. (Permanently establish a Kalihi Valley Restricted Parking Zone to improve the resident on-street parking availability in Kalihi Valley.)
