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# FOR ACTION

- 1. <u>RESOLUTION 20-334</u> ACCEPTING OWNERSHIP OF THE PORTION OF WAIMANU STREET BETWEEN WARD AVENUE AND DREIER STREET DEEMED TO HAVE BEEN SURRENDERED TO THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU. Accepting ownership of the portion of Waimanu Street between Ward Avenue and Dreier Street deemed to have been surrendered to the City and County of Honolulu from the State pursuant to Administrative Order Issued by the State Director of Transportation in accordance with Act 208 (2017), Codified as Hawaii Revised Statutes Section 264-2.1. (Committee postponed action 2/3/21)
- <u>RESOLUTION 21-34</u> ACCESS TO MEETINGS OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU. Urging increased flexibility for electronic participation in and public access to meetings of the City and County of Honolulu Boards and Commissions, City Council, and other City agencies to increase and assure effective citizen participation. (Committee postponed action 2/3/21)
- 3. <u>BILL 68 (2020)</u> RELATING TO GASOLINE-POWERED LEAF BLOWERS. Banning the sale and use of certain gasoline-powered leaf blowers in the City, while providing a reasonable period of time to transition to alternative battery-powered or human-powered equipment. (Bill passed first reading 10/7/20).

PROPOSED CD1 TO BILL 68 (2020) (Submitted by Councilmember Menor) – The CD1 (OCS2020-1237/12/3/2020 12:28 PM) makes the following amendments:

- A. Adds new definitions for "condominium," "condominium association," "cooperative housing corporation," "operations," and "planned community association."
- B. Adds a new exemption in the proposed Section 41-\_\_.5 that provides that the prohibition in the article does not apply to activities of a condominium association, cooperative housing corporation, or planned community association that has authorized the use of gasoline-powered leaf blowers in its operations.
- C. Makes miscellaneous technical and nonsubstantive amendments.
