- 2. Each speaker may not have anyone else read their statement and is limited to a one-minute presentation.

- 3. <u>RESOLUTION 21-51</u> PARK CLOSURE HOURS FOR VARIOUS BEACH PARKS. Urging the Department of Parks and Recreation to establish dusk to dawn park closure hours for Makalei Beach Park, Leahi Beach Park, Diamond Head Beach Park, and Kuilei Cliffs Beach Park.
- 4. <u>BILL 93 (2020), CD1, FD1</u> GENDER EQUITY FOR CERTAIN SPORTS REQUIRING A PARK USE PERMIT. Requires gender equity for certain sports activities that require a park use permit issued by the Department of Parks and Recreation. (Bill passed Second Reading and public hearing held on 2/17/21)
